MEET... Florida Head Football Coach Charley Pell



Charley Pell, the 38-year-old head football coach at the University of Florida, is a man who loves a challenge. His track record is proof he is equal to whatever the task.

He played only one year of high school football in Albertville, Ala. and went to the University of Alabama as a 180-pound tackle, not really the type of credentials expected to impress legendary Tide coach Paul Bryant.

Pell, who knows no speed but full speed, battled his way to the first team, playing both ways in the line of scrimmage, starting for three years and playing on the National Championship team of 1961.

Pell's coaching career started at Alabama in 1964 as a graduate assistant, a position he held for two seasons before moving to his first full-time coaching job. He joined the Kentucky staff in 1965 as defensive line coach, going to a school which had two winning seasons out of the previous eight, with records ranging from a high of 5-4-1 to a low of 3-7. The first season he was there Kentucky finished 6-4,

the best Wildcat record in 20 years, and beat Sugar Bowl champion Missouri and Liberty Bowl king Ole Miss, plus Georgia, which had beaten Alabama.

His first head coaching job was at Jacksonville State in 1969. He took over a squad which had posted winning marks only twice in the previous six years, and had a 3-6 record in 1968. In two years his team finished 10-0, second in the nation in Division II, one of the three Top 10 Division II teams he produced in five seasons.

Pell went to Virginia Tech as defensive coordinator in 1974, joining a program which had losing teams four of the prior five seasons and was 2-9 in 1973. In his second season the revived Tech defense led the Gobblers to an 8-3 record.

When he joined the Clemson staff as defensive coordinator, the Tigers were coming off a season where their defensive unit finished 128th in the nation and gave up over 30 points or more on seven different Saturdays.

His first year as defensive coor-

dinator saw the Tiger defense finish 29th in the nation in defense against scoring.

The 1977 season at Clemson, Pell's first as Head Football Coach, was something the best fiction writer wouldn't have dreamed up. The Tigers had had only one winning season in the previous eight years and wound up 3-6-2 in 1976.

Pell debuted at 8-3-1, took his team to the Gator Bowl, produced the best Clemson record since 1959, smashed school offensive records right-and-left after installing the "I-Formation" and his club finished third in the nation in defense against scoring.

He was named Atlantic Coast Conference Coach-of-The-Year, gathering 116 of the 124 votes cast.

1978 was even better as Clemson finished 10-1, got another Gator Bowl invitation, won the ACC championship and Pell was once again the league's top-heavy choice as Coach-of-The-Year.

Coach Pell, the man who loves a challenge, has taken over, three times in five stops, programs which were 3-6

or 2-9. Three times the record has been up to 11-0, 10-0 and 10-1 within three years.

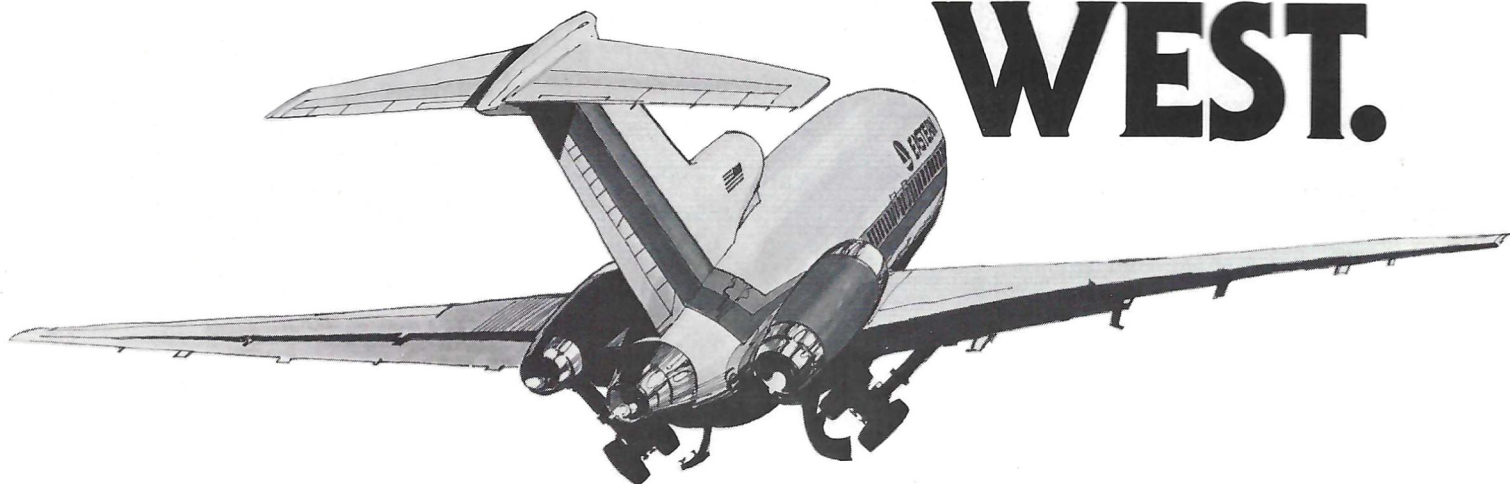

Was NCAA District III, Atlantic Coast Conference, and State of South Carolina Coach of the Year in 1977 and 1978.

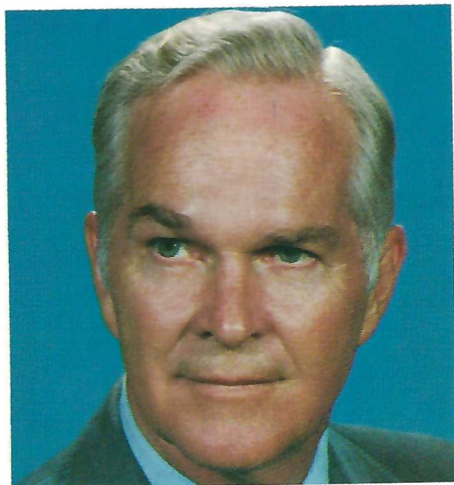

Dr. Robert Q. Marston, President



Dr. Robert Quarles Marston, the seventh president of the University of Florida, has spent his professional life in medicine and education. He was Associate Director of the National Institutes of Health and Director of the Division of Regional Medical Programs, 1966-68; Director of the National Institutes of Health, 1968-73; Dean of the College of

Medicine of the University of Mississippi, 1961-65; Vice Chancellor of the University of Mississippi 1965-66; and a member of the faculty of the Medical College of Virginia, 1954-57 and 1955-61, and the University of Minnesota, 1958-59.

Dr. Marston was educated in the Virginia Military Institute (B.S.-1943), Medical College of Virginia (M.D.-1947) and as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University (B.Sc.-1949). He also received training at Johns Hopkins, Vanderbilt and the National Institute of Health. He came to the University of Florida August 1, 1974, from positions as scholar-in-residence at the University of Virginia and as a distinguished fellow at the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences.

In addition to being a Rhodes Scholar, Dr. Marston has been

honored as a Markle scholar; a member of the Society of Scholars, Johns Hopkins University; and a fellow (honorary) of Lincoln College, Oxford. His honorary Doctor of Science degrees include one from the College of William and Mary in the area of his birth. A member of several professional societies, he is a distinguished service member of the Association of American Medical Colleges, an honorary member of the National Medical Association and the American Hospital Association, and a member of the Association of American Physicians and the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences.

Dr. Marston served as a First Lieutenant in the United States Army. He was born in Toano, Virginia, in 1923 and he and his wife, Ann, have three children, Ann, Rob, and Wes.

Bill Carr, Director Of Athletics



Bill Carr, a dynamic young leader who worked his way up through the ranks in the Gator athletic program, assumed duties as Director of Athletics at the University of Florida on March 15, 1979.

Carr served as a graduate assistant football coach at Florida

in 1970-71 and joined the staff full-time in April of 1972 as academic advisor and junior varsity assistant coach.

He turned to athletic administration in 1974, and was named assistant to Athletic Director Ray Graves. In 1976, he was named assistant athletic director working primarily with spring sports budgeting, scheduling, facility maintenance and athletic eligibility.

Carr, in his own words, best describes his former position as "the nuts and bolts man in the organization."

Carr was a first string All-America center for Florida in 1966. He started 32 consecutive games for the Gators, playing in the 1965 Sugar Bowl and the 1966 Orange Bowl. He was of-

ensive captain of the 1966 team and was on the taxi squad of the New Orleans Saints in 1967.

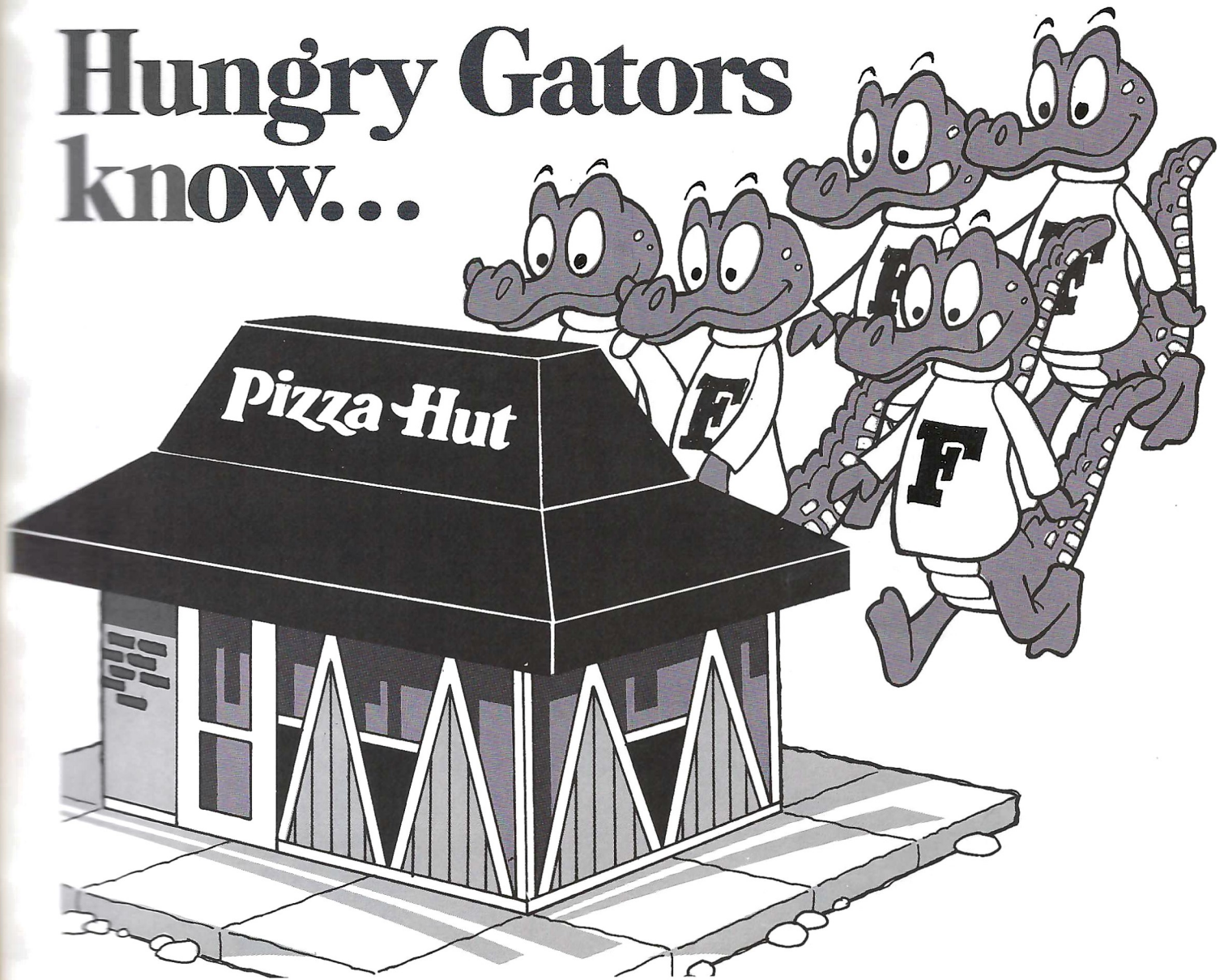
An ROTC commissioned officer, Carr spent 1968-69 in the Army, serving in Korea for one year.

Carr was born in Gainesville on Nov. 29, 1945. He attended elementary school in Vero Beach and high school in Pensacola, the son of a Baptist minister moving around to various churches. He graduated from Florida with a BA in Spanish (1967) and an MA in Education Administration (1971). He is married to the former Jan Jackson and they have two sons, Jason (8), Scott (6) and a daughter, Julie (3).

Carr is an elder in the Community Evangelical Free Church.

Ray Graves



Ray Graves retired as Director of Athletics at the University of Florida on March 15, 1979, following an illustrious collegiate coaching and administrative career which spanned over three decades in the Southeastern Conference.

Graves' newest challenge will include fund-raising and special projects for both the University of Florida Foundation and the Gator athletic program.

During his 18 years as Director of Athletics at Florida, Graves helped provide the leadership which kept the Gator athletic program near the top of the SEC. Florida athletic teams have won three national crowns (two golf, one women's swimming), 22 SEC titles and captured the SEC All-Sports Championship five times during this period.

His overall record as Head Football Coach at Florida was 70-31-4, a .686 winning percentage. Five of his teams went to bowl games and four were victorious. His teams won the 1960, '62 and '69 Gator Bowls and the 1967 Orange Bowl. His decade of 1960-69 also produced 14 All Americans and the 1966 Heisman Trophy winner, Steve Spurrier.

Graves' coaching career began at his alma mater, Tennessee, in 1944. In 1946 he joined the staff of Coach Bobby Dodd at Georgia Tech and he spent 13 years there as head line coach and assistant head coach. He coached on eight bowl teams, helped produce 15 All-Americans and was credited with developing the "Monster" scheme of defense.

Graves was born December 31, 1918, on Black Oak Ridge, Knox County, Tennessee and was a star athlete at Central High in Knoxville, and the University of Tennessee, where he was a three-year starter at center and captain of the 1941 Vols.

In April, 1972, Graves was elected to the Florida Sports Writers Association Hall of Fame.

Graves is married to the former Opal Richardson of New Tazewell, Tenn. and has three daughters — Mrs. Bill (Becky) Shaw, Mrs. Bob (Kathy) Oakley and Mrs. Burton (Beth) Rosenberg. Coach and Mrs. Graves have three grandchildren, Katherine Courtney Shaw, Martin Rosenberg and Ansley Elizabeth Shaw.

UF Alumnus Alfred McKethan Donates \$600,000 For Teaching Chair

A \$600,000 gift from a UF alumnus announced by University of Florida President Robert Q. Marston will be matched with \$400,000 from a trust fund set up by the 1979 legislature to establish teaching chairs at the state's universities.

Gov. Bob Graham said the gift from Brooksville banker and one-time chairman of the old State Road Board Alfred A. McKethan will make possible "the first of a number of eminent scholars at the university and throughout the state.

McKethan has asked that the endowed chair be named for the late Walter Matherly, dean of the College of Business Administration from 1926 to 1954.

The 1979 legislature established the \$10-million endowment fund for eminent scholars to be divided evenly among the state's nine universities. For each \$600,000 gift a university receives, the state will match it with \$400,000. Interest on the \$1-million endowment will pay or supplement the salary of an eminent professor.

Resulting principally from efforts by Sen. Jack Gordon of Miami Beach and Rep. Richard Hodes of Tampa, the eminent scholars legislation intends "to provide each state university the opportunity to receive and match challenge grants to create endowments for selected eminent scholars to occupy chairs within the universities." It is part of the Post-Secondary Education Act.

Marston said McKethan's gift is "important to every taxpayer in the state and to other potential donors who want assurance that their gift will be maximally effective."

A third generation Floridian, McKethan followed his father as president of Brooksville's Hernando State Bank in 1942. He now is chairman of the bank's board of directors, while his son-in-law, James Kimbrough, also a UF graduate, is president.

McKethan has kept close ties with UF. He is a member of the President's Council, a UF support group.

He also recently established a \$50,000 athletic scholarship for UF athletes with good grades.

Attending UF has been a family tradition McKethan has encouraged.



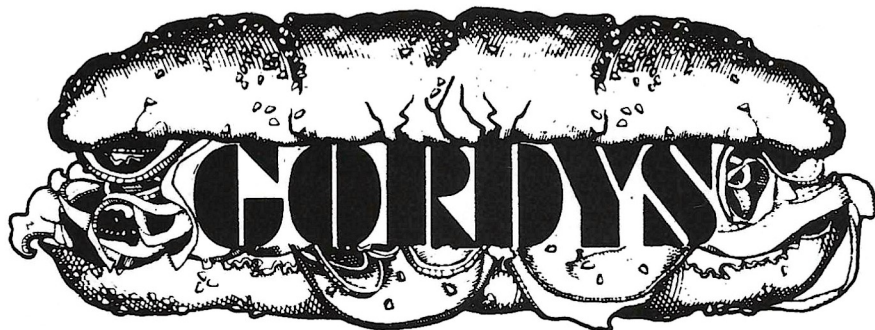

University Facts

GENERAL INFORMATION

The University of Florida, located in Gainesville, is a coeducational state university and land-grant college with a faculty of 2,500 and a student body of 31,000. The physical plant is valued at more than \$300 million and includes more than 700 buildings on 2,000 acres.

The University has conferred more than 125,000 degrees since its founding. There are 5,000 individual courses offered providing 90 areas of instructional specialization for undergraduates and more than 50 specialties for doctoral degrees.

Tracing its beginning to 1853 (founding date of the East Florida Seminary, one of six state-supported institutions consolidated in 1905 to form the University of Florida), classes on the present campus first were held in 1906.

There have been seven presidents: Dr. Andrew Sledd (1905-09), Dr. Albert A. Murphree (1909-28), Dr. John J. Tigert (1928-47), Dr. J. Hillis Miller (1947-53), Dr. J. Wayne Reitz (1955-67), Dr. Stephen C. O'Connell (1967-73) and Dr. Robert Q. Marston (1974-).

COLLEGES

Encompassing 16 colleges and three schools, the University offers programs ranging from general to highly specialized education. It is unique in that all of its colleges are located on a single campus where the professional skills represented in the various departments can combine for interdisciplinary work.

SERVICE

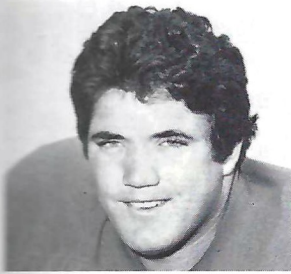
In addition to numerous research projects in the colleges, the University has specialized laboratories carrying on continuous basic research in engineering, science, agriculture, forestry, business, public administration, architecture, building construction and other areas which make significant contributions to private industry and governmental agencies.

A broad program in medical education, research and patient care is carried out in the J. Hillis Miller Health Center. The expansion program provides space for the College of Dentistry.

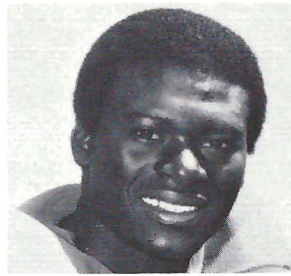
The Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences is the University's statewide agricultural research and educational organization. Its purpose is accomplished through 18 departments and the School of Forest Resources and Conservation in Gainesville and the efforts of 22 research and education centers throughout the state.

The Division of Continuing Education enables the University to be responsive to the varied and changing needs of Florida's citizens. Last year 80,000 people obtained educational opportunities through credit, non-credit and special programs of the division.

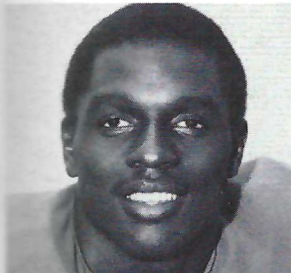

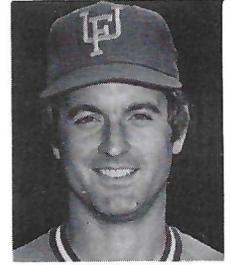
Baseball Rebuilding

That old baseball adage about not knowing the players without a scorecard will certainly be true this season for the Gators as Head Coach Jay Bergman faces a major rebuilding job.

A total of 13 lettermen were lost from last year's squad that captured its third consecutive Southeastern Conference Eastern Division title, finished second in the league's post-season tournament and claimed a third-place finish in the NCAA's East Regional. Six of those 13 were starters, five of whom signed professional contracts.

Returning from that 40-20 team are leftfielder David Banes (.349), second baseman Ronnie Deans (.339), and designated-hitter Tony Stevens (.315). Stevens also slugged 12 home runs and drove in 74 runs to set school records in both departments.

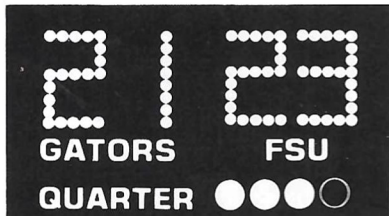
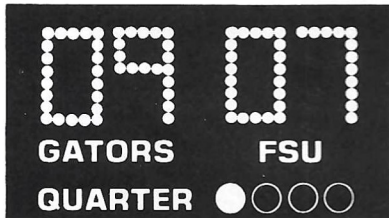
The fifth-year coach will look to a stellar crop of junior college transfers to fill the gaps in his starting lineup.

They include outfielders Craig McGraw, Scott Carpenter and Jim Yonker; infielders Steve Floyd, Mike Henley and Steve Lombradozzi; and catchers Ron Cardieri and Danny Ramsier.

On the pitching mound Assistant Coach Steve Webber must find replacements for three graduated starters (each of whom signed pro contracts). Last year's relief ace Mike Grant, who appeared in a school record 28 games while fashioning a 7-4 record, will be used as a starter this season, while Rob Murphy and Randy Perkins, a pair of talented lefthanders, should challenge for a spot in the regular rotation.

Despite the fact two signees elected to sign major league contracts, Webber will nevertheless have a solid group of JuCo transfers to work with in the persons of Larry Mikesell, Shawn Methena, Carlos Moreno, and Mike Casey.

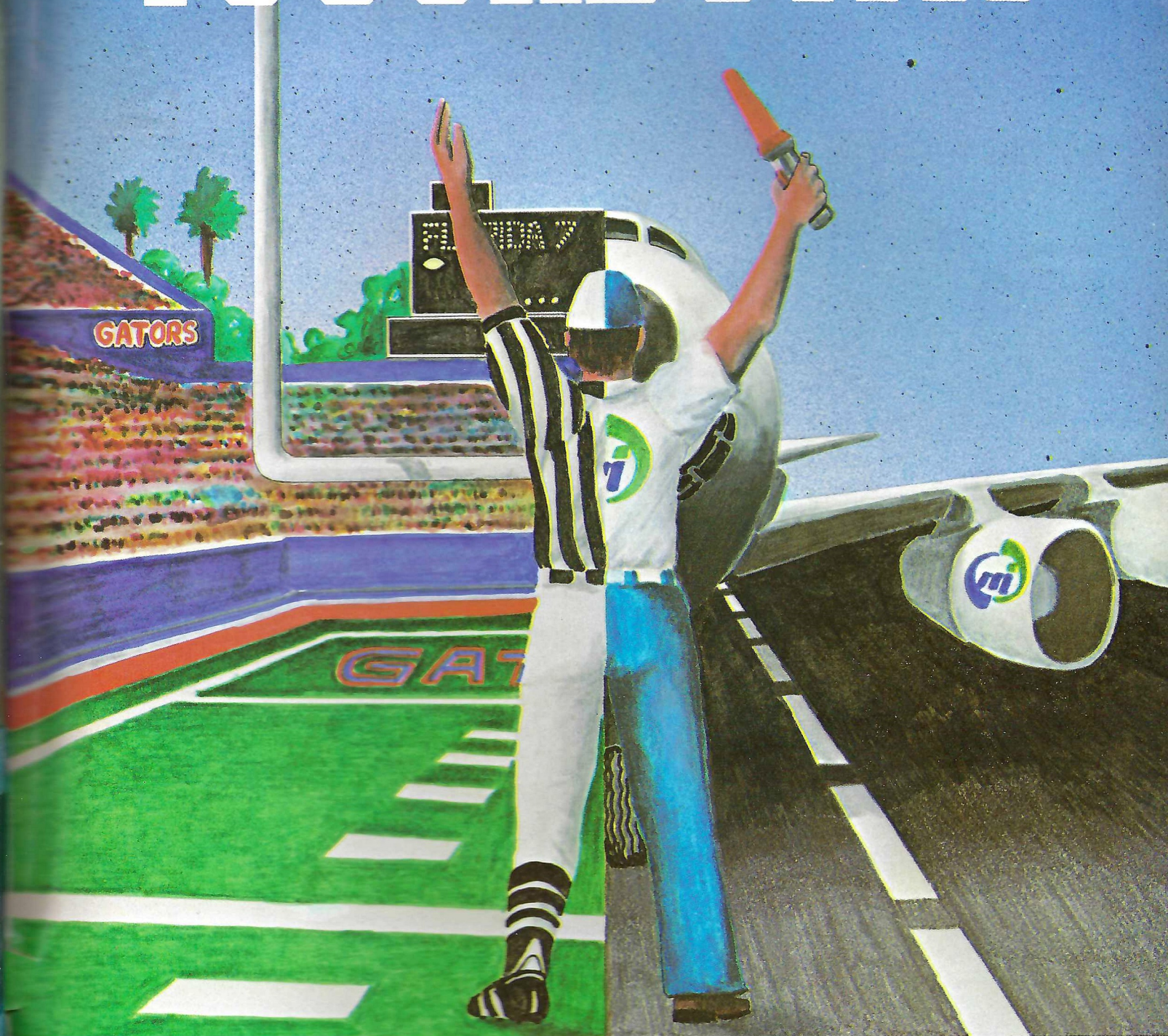

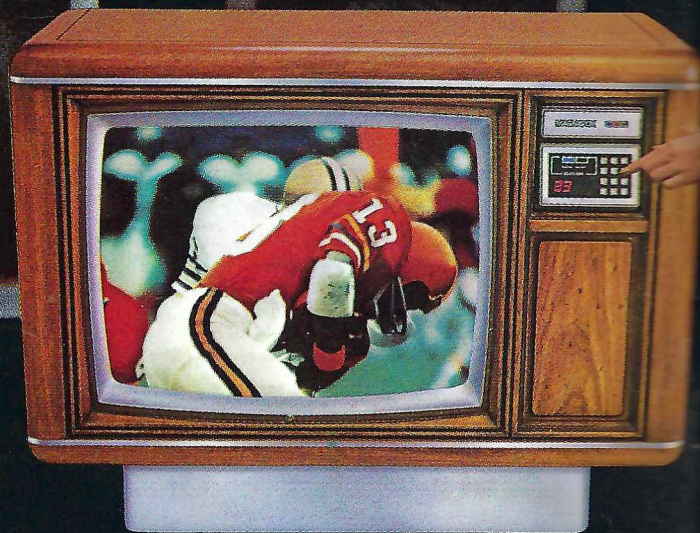
