

FIRST AID

Seven first aid stations and one cardiac emergency station are manned by volunteers of the Capital Area Chapter, American Red Cross. In the event of an emergency, contact ushers, marshalls, first aiders or policemen on duty for assistance.

REST ROOMS

Men's and Ladies' rest rooms are located beneath the stands in all four sides of the stadium and on the concourse of the upper deck in west stadium.

PUBLIC TELEPHONES

Public telephones are located on the ground level under each of the four stands, in the center of the south upper deck, and on the concourse of the upper deck in west stadium.



"The freshmen have to work hard to get on the travel squad. For me, I know I'm going, because I'm a starter. But some players have to wait to see if they're going."






Louisiana State University



ousiana State University is one of 68 American institutions of higher learning that originated from Thomas Jefferson's idea of allocating funds from the sale of public lands to the states for the endowment of public education for all citizens.

This land-grant idea dedicated the University to a philosophy of "knowledge for use by all" and established its long-standing tradition of a university "operated for the good it can do; for the people it can serve; for the science it can promote." In 1978, LSU also became the nation's 13th sea-grant college, under a federal program created in 1966 to accelerate development of marine resources.

LSU began as the Louisiana State Seminary of Learning and Military Academy on January 2, 1860, at Pineville, Louisiana, with 19 students and five faculty members headed by Superintendent William Tecumseh Sherman. The young institution survived the ravages of the Civil War, Reconstruction, and a fire that destroyed its sole structure in 1869. It has been in Baton Rouge since then, occupying three different sites. Construction of the present campus, located on a 1,944-acre tract (once a cotton plantation on the southern edge of Baton Rouge), was begun in 1922 and the campus was dedicated April 30, 1926.

LSU is one of the few schools which combines the resources of a state university, a land-grant agricultural and mechanical college, and a sea-grant college. As such, it is a synergistic instance whose functions of instruction reached and public service are interrelated rally and operationally—with the analysis of scholarly investigation service to the campus public an outgrowth of the combination.

Head Coach Jerry Stovall

After becoming head football coach at his alma mater, LSU, culminating a lifetime of hopes and dreams to succeed to this post, the consensus

erry Stovall confounded a mess of

succeed to this post, the consensus among most of the observers of the gridiron scene was that the LSU Fighting Tigers would end the 1980 campaign in comparative anonymity.

Predictions of 2-9-0 and 3-8-0 were commonplace and the choices as to where the Tigers would finish in the Southeastern Conference were from

fifth to eighth place.

But Jerry's zest for coaching; his rapport with young people; his genuineness; his ability to generate instant loyalty among his staff; these and other attributes combined to impart a sense of togetherness among the football squad, the coaching staff and the fans. The 38-year-old Stovall, a native of West Monroe, La., was an All-America halfback for the Tigers in the early 1960s, and had served as Varsity Club Coordinator in 1979 after returning to Tigertown in 1974 as offensive backfield coach under former Coach Charles McClendon. During his tenure he tutored Terry Robiskie, who established LSU rushing records, and Charles Alexander, a two-time All-America who eclipsed Robiskie's marks.

Jerry's life has been intertwined with LSU even though his career took him to other locales during his post-college days.

Born April 30, 1941, he matriculated at LSU where he starred under then coach Paul Dietzel (now the LSU director of athletics) and McClendon. Dietzel was his head coach during his first three seasons at Tigertown while Cholly Mac was the bossman in his senior year, a year



when he was runner-up to Oregon's Terry Baker for the Heisman Trophy. Other honors included All-SEC sophomore team in 1960; All-SEC in both 1961 and 1962; unanimous All-America in 1962; and SEC Player of the Year in 1962.


Playing both ways running back on offense and safety on defense ... Jerry rushed for 1,061 yards in 219 carries for a 4.8-yard average, scored 15 touchdowns and was the leading pass receiver during his sophomore and senior campaigns. His total rushing yardage ranks him 18th on the all-time LSU list, a remarkable achievement since these statistics were compiled in a day when defense was the order of college football.

Following the completion of his eligibility at LSU, Jerry was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals where he played strong safety. He was selected to the All-Pro squads in 1967 and 1968, and participated in the Pro Bowls in 1967, 1968 and 1969.

He retired from the pro ranks following the 1971 season and immediately joined his old mentor, Paul Dietzel, as an assistant coach at South Carolina. He worked there for the next two years before coming home to LSU in 1974.

Stovall is married to the former Judy Ward of Alexandria, La., a wedding which took place in February, 1962, while he was a junior and she a sophomore at LSU. However, the start of the romance antedated the marriage vows by some four years when young Judy's family moved from Alexandria to West Monroe when she was a high school sophomore. The union has produced two children, Jerry Lane, Jr., known as Jay, 16, and Jodi Ann, 11.

An active worker in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Jerry Stovall is a tireless man on the go, but his exuberance and gregariousness are such that he revels in being around all people. He has been assigned a monumental task, but Jerry Stovall's class and character, his enthusiastic approach to any job indicates that he is the man to keep LSU as a dominant power in intercollegiate football competition.

Having gained distinction as the first university press to publish a novel that won a Pulitzer Prize for Fiction, the LSU Press in its current Fall/Winter Catalog features an exciting diversity of new works. 
As early as 1912 the University was publishing works by various faculty members, but it was in 1931 that the first book to carry an LSU Press imprint was released. Several years later, in 1935, the need to consolidate sporadic publishing by various campus departments resulted in the official establishment of the University press with Dr. Marcus Wilkerson chosen as director. At the time, Wilkerson was a one-man staff, managing and watching the growth of the

press, serving as director until his death in 1953.

Through those years and the many that have followed, the LSU Press has become recognized internationally as one of the most respected university publishing houses and one of the South's largest publishers. Highly acclaimed publications, noted authors, and numerous awards and honors have characterized the press from the days of its inception, which certainly continue today.

In its modern facilities in the recently renovated French House, the press is a vital part of the University community, annually bringing to LSU added renown as a major center of thought, research, and study of the highest calibre.



Mediterranean Seafood


Alan Davidson





1981-82 LSU Basketball

While many followers of LSU basketball will be weeping over the loss of seniors Durand Macklin, Ethan Martin, Greg Cook, Willie Sims and Andy Campbell via graduation, all is not lost for the 1981-82 Tigers.

Four of those five seniors were drafted (all except Campbell), but an outstanding pair of underclassmen remain.

Junior Howard Carter and sophomore Leonard Mitchell will form the nucleus around which head coach Dale Brown (161–92.636) will try to rebuild a Tiger team that won the most games in the nation last year, 31. Carter, selected to the All-SEC Tournament team and to the AP and UPI All-SEC squad, was the Tiger's leading scorer last season with a 16.0 norm. Mitchell, a raw freshman talent who became more polished and smooth as the season progressed, averaged 10.8 points and 7.2 rebounds on the year. He landed on the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament team after his first three games as a collegiate player and then was tabbed for the SEC's All-Freshman squad.

Carter will likely fill the big guard slot, while Mitchell may be played at either forward or center, leaving Brown to fill three more positions. The heir-apparent at center will be 6-8. 200-pounder Tyrone Black, a junior who participated in 21 games last year, including a starting berth in six. The other guard slot could be filled by sophomore Johnny Jones who played in all 36 games last season, but freshman Derrick Taylor or 6-5 soph John Tudor could move in

Although a host of lettermen (8) remain in contention for the second forward slot, freshman Steffond Johnson (6-8, 200) from Longview, Texas, should have the inside track. He will be competing against lettermen Joe Costello, Matt England or Brian Kistler, while walk-on Drexal Allen will be looking for playing time at the guard position.

Three freshmen, 6-10 Ray Borner, Johnson and 6-0 Derrick Taylor, will be joining the eight lettermen when the squad reports for the first day of practice on Oct. 15, comprising one of the smallest squads in Brown's nine years at Tigertown. Five players graduated from the 1980-81 squad, while two others were lost to attrition from the squad that won the most games in LSU history last year.

A tough schedule, featuring NCAA Tournament participants Wichita State, Mississippl. Tennessee, Kentucky, and UCLA continue to make LSU's schedule one of the toughest in the country.

CFA—NCAA

College Football at the Crossroads

One of the most perplexing matters facing college football fans today is the National Collegiate Athletic Association vs. the College Football Association

Are there philosophical differences which have brought on this confrontation within the broader confines of the NCAA?

Perhaps it is oversimplification, but the polarization of the two organizations can be solved and must be solved through revised legislation.

And because of that there will be a special convention of the NCAA in early December in an effort to reorganize Division 1-A so that the schools with similar football programs such as LSU, Notre Dame, Texas, Penn State, Alabama, et al, can decide their own destinies.

Chancellor James H. Wharton has issued the following statement to explain LSU's posture:

"Louisiana State University holds membership in the College Football Association (CFA) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). As an institution, LSU is committed to the functions, purposes, and ideals of both associations and expects to retain membership in both associations. The property rights to televising all University events are considered to belong to the taxpayers of Louisiana as represented by the Board of Supervisors. When the CFA negotiated a contract for televising college football games with NBC, the University considered that contract to be an attractive alternative to past contracts because it provided greater television exposure and greater income to support our varsity athletic programs. For these reasons, LSU favored ratification of the contract.

"However, the property rights question developed into a major issue between the NCAA and member institutions of the CFA. Thus, it became necessary to settle the issue legally, and LSU supports the legal action taken by the Universities of Georgia, Oklahoma, and Texas in behalf of the CFA membership. This matter is currently pending before the courts, and when settled, LSU will be prepared to vote on an appropriate contract by which to sell its television rights. Our agent could be the CFA, NCAA, or perhaps the Southeastern Conference.

"More recently, the NCAA has agreed to consider reorganization of its Division 1-A. LSU supports the objectives of the proposed reorganization, and if the desired organization is obtained, the NCAA will be more attractive as an agent for the negotiation of television broadcasting. More importantly, the NCAA could better represent the academic goals of the major institutions."

The CFA emerged in the mid-1970s after efforts to reorganize the NCAA and develop acceptable criteria for Division 1 football failed.

The initial group of 25 schools met in 1975 in an attempt to effect this change at the 1976 NCAA convention, but the move failed and the following December an organizational meeting was held and Articles of Association adopted. Qualified institutions were invited to join and told through the CFA "... they could become a forum through which the major college football programs might refine and sponsor points of view consistent with their needs" within the NCAA.

Recently the NCAA has asked the membership for approval of a new four year television contract with ABC and CBS. Shortly thereafter the CFA negotiated a similar deal with NBC. Even though large amounts of money are involved, the financial benefits are not the bottom line.

That was the catalyst for the calling of the special convention.

The point is that the major colleges wish to decide their own destinies; that the schools with large stadia and immense expenses be able to address their problems on an equitable scale; that academics be stressed and entrance requirements be elevated rather than legislate major schools to the common denominator of schools which do not have similar problems.

John Underwood in his extremely insightful article in a recent issue of Sports Illustrated put it this way:

"Make no mistake. The real issue is the conflict between the NCAA and the 61 rebellious Division 1-A football schools—known collectively as the College Football Association—was never over which of the TV networks would be allowed to heap millions of dollars on the big-time football powers... those were mere diversionary tactics. What the two outfits were really arguing about was whether there would be a reorganization of the NCAA that would give the big-time schools firm control of big-time football."

And one of the primary points as far as the members of the CFA are concerned are stricter recruiting rules and academic requirements, but rules tailored to the requirements of these schools.

Charles M. Neinas is executive director of the CFA and he is a man whose background includes stints as an executive with the NCAA and commissioner of the Big Eight Conference. But he works at the direction of the CFA Board of Directors which is chaired by a man known to LSU: Dr. Fred C. Davison, president of the University of Georgia.

The next couple of months will prove extremely interesting to college football fans.



George S. Bowman, Jr.

"L" Club Man of the Year

George Shepard Bowman, Jr., was born December 24, 1911 in Hammond, La., and completed his elementary and high school grades there. In 1931, he entered Louisiana State University and received a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering upon graduation in 1936.

Active in sports during his school years, he was a five-letter winner at LSU, participating in football, track and baseball.

He won three letters in football and two in track, being selected as captain of the LSU team in the Tulane game of 1935 and the Sugar Bowl game on January 1, 1936.

He was co-captain of LSU's Southeastern Conference championship track team in 1936 and was a member of LSU's first SEC championship football team.

In 1932, he was one of four LSU trackmen to reach the Olympic finals trials in California

Tonight he will join five other LSU alums who have been named as "L" Club Man of the Year.

Dr. Marty Broussard became the first "Man of the Year" in 1976 and since that time, Bob Pettit, Joseph E. Reid, Jerry Guillot, Dr. Abe Mickal and now, George Shepard Bowman, Jr., is added to the list of former LSU athletes who have risen to the top in support of LSU varsity athletics.

While at LSU, George was a member of the LSU 4th Corps Area championship rifle team, Sergeant Major of the Cadet Corps, Cadet Colonel of the Cadet Corps, President of the College of Engineering and served two years on the student council.

He was a member of the Delta Kappa Epsilon, Omicron Delta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi; Sigma Delta Phi; Pi Beta Tau; Theta Nu Epsilon; Scabbard & Blade.

In July of 1936, he was appointed a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps designated as a Naval Aviator in 1939 and embarked on a career which brought continuing advancements in rank and position of great responsibility through military life.

As a Brigadier General in 1964, he be-

came Commanding General, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing, and was promoted to Major General in 1965. He saw duty as Deputy Commander, Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic and was Marine Corps Liaison Officer to the Office of Chief of Naval Operations in Washington, D.C. He served as Deputy Commander, III Marine Amphibious Force, and Deputy Commander, XXIV Corps, in Vietnam during 1969 and 1970.


In August, 1970, he became Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton, Calif., and remained in that capacity until he retired from the Marine Corps.

Bowman then became Superintendent of the Marine Military Academy, Harlingen, Texas, and took the Academy from a time of little growth and instituted policies that led to a 120 percent increase in student enrollment. He was also instrumental in establishing an Endowment Fund and a \$500,000 scholarship program that is still growing.

He retired as Superintendent in June, 1978

Bowman is a member of numerous military related organizations, civic and community organizations and in 1980 began construction on the George Bowman Track and Football Field at the Marine Military Academy with a grant from Mr. and Mrs. Harold lames.

He has been listed in "Who's Who in America" since 1967.


