

Charley Pell Florida Head Football Coach

Charles Byron (Charley) Pell was named Head Football Coach at the University of Florida on Dec. 4, 1978, bringing with him a reputation as a coach who turns ailing collegiate football programs around quickly.

Pell's second Gator squad hit the field in 1980 and proved his reputation was well-founded. The Gators went 8-4, were the nation's most improved football team and capped the year by winning the Tangerine Bowl and winding up 19th in the nation.

Both Associated Press and United Press International honored the 40-year-old native of Albertville, Ala. by naming him SEC Coach-Of-The-Year, the third time in four years of Division I coaching Pell has been so honored.

Pell was Atlantic Coast Conference Coach-Of-The-Year in both 1977 and 1978 while coaching Clemson to 8-2-1 in 1977 and 10-1 in 1978, both teams going to the Gator Bowl and the '78 edition winning the ACC title.

His injury-riddled 1979 Florida team, playing the nation's toughest schedule, finished 0-10-1, setting up one of the most dramatic turnarounds in college football history.

Pell's 1980 team was the third most improved from one season to the next in college history and became the first team in the history of college football to go winless in one season and to a bowl the next year.


Pell is a hard-working competitor whose only speed is full-speed. He went to the University of Alabama as a 180-pound halfback who had played only one season of high school football. He wound up starting for three years at offensive and defensive tackle (1960-62) and was a member of the Tide's 1961 National Championship team. He also played in the Orange, Sugar and Bluebonnet bowls.

Following graduation he served as graduate assistant coach on Coach Paul (Bear) Bryant's 1964 Alabama team, was defensive line coach at Kentucky (1965-68), head coach at Jacksonville State (1969-73) and assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Virginia Tech (1974-75), a position he also held at Clemson in 1976.

At Jacksonville State Pell inherited a losing team and turned it into a small college power which finished second in the nation in 1970 while posting a 10-0 record and beating Florida A&M in the Orange Blossom Classic. His overall mark at JSU was 33-13-1, and he was Coach-Of-The-Year for the State of Alabama in both 1970 and 1973, and runner-up for Division II national honors in 1970.

Pell holds a BS degree from Alabama (1964). He married the former Ward Noel of Lexington, Ky. on Feb. 1, 1969, and they have a son, Carrick, who was born March 1, 1970.

Pell was born Feb. 27, 1941 in Albertville, Ala.



Greg Branch called the other day. Wanted to take out an ad in the Florida-FSU program promoting the fact he is a devout Gator.

We didn't have any space in the program but thought his cause worthwhile enough to mention here. Seems Greg is catching some flak from folks in Ocala over the name of his business firm.

It's called "Seminole Stores, Inc."

While this class of Florida seniors is few in numbers it is large in accomplishments.

There are only six members, one of these being a transfer student from a school which dropped football last season and another an "injury hardship" who received an extra year of eligibility.


Still another, placekicker Brian Clark, is a redshirt who is actually in graduate school now. This leaves the only true seniors, running backs Calvin Davis and Shannon Burch and nose guard Robin Fisher.

The transfer is punter Joe Borajkiewicz from Villanova, and defensive tackle David Galloway received the hardship year after a knee injury in the 1979 opener against Houston.

The accomplishments:

Clark is the team's leading scorer for the third straight season. He has already broken the school record for most career field goals (41), longest field goal (55 yards vs. Kentucky) and consecutive extra points (59). He holds the school record and is tied for the SEC record for field goals in one game with five against Ole Miss in 1980. He goes into today's game tied for the school and SEC record for field goals in one season with 16.

Galloway has established himself as one of the greatest defensive linemen in Florida history. He is a finalist in voting for the Lombardi Award, has made at least one major All-America team to be announced later and is a solid All-SEC performer.





Dr. Robert Q. Marston, President



Dr. Robert Quarles Marston, the seventh president of the University of Florida, has spent his professional life in medicine and education. He was Associate Director of the National Institutes of Health and Director of the Division of Regional Medical Programs, 1966-68; Director of the National Institutes of Health, 1968-73; Dean of the College of Medicine of the University of Mississippi, 1961-65; Vice Chancellor of the University of Mississippi, 1965-66; and a member of the faculty of the Medical College of Virginia, 1954-57 and 1955-61, and the University of Minnesota, 1958-59.

Dr. Marston was educated in the Virginia Military Institute (B.S.-1943), Medical College of Virginia (M.D.-1947) and is a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University. (B.Sc.-1949). He also received training at Johns Hopkins, Vanderbilt and the National Institute of Health. He came to the University of Florida August 1, 1974, from positions as scholar-in-residence at the University of Virginia and as a

distinguished fellow at the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences.

In addition to being a Rhodes Scholar, Dr. Marston has been honored as a Markle scholar; a member of the Society of Scholars, Johns Hopkins University: and a fellow (honorary) of Lincoln College, Oxford. His honorary Doctor of Science degrees include one from the College of William and Mary in the area of his birth. A member of several professional societies, he is a distinguished service member of the Association of American Medical Colleges, an honorary member of the National Medical Association and the American Hospital Association, and a member of the Association of American Physicians and the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences.

Dr. Marston served as a First Lieutenant in the United States Army. He was born in Toano, Virginia, in 1923 and he and his wife, Ann, have three children, Ann, Rob, and Wes.

Bill Carr, Director of Athletics



Bill Carr assumed the duties of Director of Athletics at Florida on March 15, 1979 and immediately started a whirlwind operational plan designed to improve the Gator athletic program in every area.

Two years later he is certainly on schedule in all areas and well ahead in many. Florida can point with pride to the vastly improved athletic facilities, organization of Gator Clubs to promote academic-athletic interests, coaching changes resulting in positive growth, improved image of the Gator athletic program among its supporters, increased funding of athletics from private sources and, in general, an uplifting of the entire process by which the program is operated.

Carr is the driving force behind all of these developments.

He worked his way up through the athletic program as an assistant football

coach, 1970-73, academic advisor, 1972-74, and assistant athletic director, starting in 1976, working primarily with spring sports budgeting, scheduling, facility maintenance and athletic eligibility.

Carr was a first string All-America center for the Gators in 1966 and played in 32 consecutive games from 1964-1966, including the 1965 Sugar Bowl and 1966 Orange Bowl.

Carr was born in Gainesville on November 29, 1945. He attended elementary school in Vero Beach, high school in Pensacola and is the son of a Baptist minister. He graduated from Florida with a BA in Spanish in 1967, earning an MA in Education Administration in 1971 following service in Korea with the U.S. Army.

Carr, an elder in the Community Evangelical Free Church, is married to the former Jan Jackson and they have three children, Jason (10), Scott (8) and Julie (5).

Testing Center Gets Data On Athletic Performance and Potential To Perform

This testing is done in the interdisciplinary Center for Physical and Motor Fitness. The center is able to test athletes on potential to perform, as well as actual performance.

The center was first proposed in 1979 by Dr. Owen Holyoak, of the physical education department, and Dr. Robert Allen. Their idea, first proposed as a center for preventive health care, was rejected by the Board of Regents. Changing the basic idea slightly, they then proposed a center for wholistic fitness, which included mental and scholastic aspects, as well as the physical fitness. This time, with the help of associate vice-president John Nattress, the board passed the request.

The new center then needed a location. The athletic department. following suggestions by coaches Norm Sloan and Charley Pell and athletic director Bill Carr, donated space in Florida Gym. The former visiting team locker room is where the center is now located.

The research team, recently tested members of the football team. Tests included percentage of body fat, strength, flexibility, cardio, respiratory, and muscular endurance. They were also tested on their motor fitness, including coordination, balance, power, reaction time, agility, and speed.

"This isn't merely a physical test," Holyoak said. "It will help us predict an athlete's potential to perform. In other words, what he is capable of, rather than what he may be producing.'

The athletes were also asked about leisure activities, diets, and family history. The results of all these questions and tests will be entered into a computer, and analyzed. A profile will be produced. Each athlete will then be given instructions, and exercise programs.

Follow-up tests will be given later in the year to see if the athlete has improved with the program. The unique part of the center is that it will be able to take these results also and enter them into the computer, and learn even more about the athlete.


The Motor Fitness Center doesn't concentrate solely on athletes, however. It will concentrate on students who aren't athletes. The center will test students who are not able to cope with the pressure of college lifestyle.


"Kids that can't cope with the pressure and pace of going to school cost us all," Holyoak said. "With the center we'll be able to do specific studies on people who are mentally ill, or kids trying to alter their lifestyles with drugs."

"We would like to start a trend of exercise training. People know it's good for them, but often they won't do it. We want to be able to tell them the right exercise for their lifestyle."

The center will also test people employed by the university. Specific groups are now being set up.

Besides concentrating on general physical fitness, the center has expertise in such areas as diabetics, and an area on the midlife problems of women. These are conducted by Dr. Christian Zauner, who is director of the research and testing at the center.

Kellogg Foundation Funds 'Agriculture and Humanities' Program at UF

A unique program designed to help students explore the ethical, cultural and philosophical perspectives of agriculture has been established at the University of Florida with a three-year grant of \$200,000 from the W. K. Kellogg Foundation of Battle Creek, Mich.

The program, "Agriculture and the Humanities," offers a variety of courses for both agriculture majors and students in other fields. It draws on the expertise of faculty members in a wide range of disciplines, including history, philosophy, anthropology, political science and English, representing the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, and the College of Agriculture. State and national agricultural leaders will be invited to serve as guest lecturers.

"Agriculture and the Humanities" is expected to become a national model for use by other institutions with agriculture programs.

and to society in general.

"We hope to share with students the values of working in agriculture, such as nurturing the earth and being aware of the consequences of the things you do, and also to appreciate the values that have been lost in the transformation of agriculture to agribusiness."

The program is an outgrowth of the University's "Humanities Perspectives on the Professions," established in 1975 to give a solid background in ethics, the humanities, and values systems to students in business, engineering, law and health care. That program is designed to prepare students to deal with issues they would face in their professions, and has become a national model.

"'Agriculture in the Humanities' has the same objective," Haynes said. "Students who eventually will become policymakers in agriculture will have had more than nar-



The program will help students explore such issues as world food supply, rural values, the environment and urban development. Courses include "Rural Peoples of the World," "The History of American Agriculture," "The Landscape in American Literature" and "Contemporary Moral Issues in Agriculture."

College of Agriculture Dean Gerald Zachariah said students will gain a better understanding of the importance of energy resources to the world food supply, of food as a political bargaining tool, and of land use decisions affecting agriculture.

According to program director Dr. Richard Haynes, "Agriculture is increasingly on the moral firing line. It's being criticized more and more by all kinds of groups, so we hope to make non-agriculture students aware of just how important decisions in agriculture are to their own lives

row technical training. They will have learned about the humanities and the values needed to make intelligent decisions."

UF sophomores, juniors and seniors enrolled for the courses beginning this fall.

In 1930, breakfast cereal pioneer W. K. Kellogg contributed \$45 million in personal wealth to establish the Kellogg Foundation. Using income from that bequest, the Foundation has made grants over the past five decades of more than \$530 million in the areas of health, education and agriculture. The Foundation is today among the largest private philanthropic organizations in the nation, and supports programs on four continents, including the United States and Canada, Europe, Latin America and Australia.

Gators vs. Seminoles Started With A Bang

The first Florida-FSU football game was held in Gainesville on November 22, 1958. It was not dictated by an act of the state legislature, as rumor now has it, although a bill "urging the two schools to begin athletic competition" was introduced and failed, 15-19.

The rivalry began, fittingly as matters have turned out, with a bang. The Gators kicked off to Jack Espenship, who handed off to the late Bobby Renn. The play fooled Florida and Renn headed down the sidelines in front of the Seminole bench.

Florida's Jimmy Dunn saved an immediate TD on the 78-yard jaunt. The Seminoles scored quickly, however, on a short plunge by tiny fullback Fred Pickard.

Shock among the Orange-Blue faithful ended two series later when All-SEC end Dave Hudson blocked a punt attempt by Renn and then ran it in for a TD to tie the game 7-7. The play appeared to burst the FSU bubble.

Star of the game was Dunn, the 142-pound Gator quarterback out of Tampa. He scored two touchdowns and was voted the game's Most Valuable Player. Ironically, Dunn had signed a one-year scholarship with FSU, then switched to a four-year Gator grant after the 1955 high school all-star football game, in which he was named most valuable player.

Florida won, 21-7, in a wild opening of a series which has become one of the nation's most competitive and exciting over the years. The Gators lead the series 16-6-1, but FSU has won the last four games, their streak coming on top of a nine-game Florida skein.

Lady Gator Sports

The crowd was tense. Lynn McDonnell was halfway through her famous balance beam routine. The Gator gymnasts were well in front of Louisville, but the Florida crowd could sense a high score for Lynn.

She finished her one and one-half full twisting dismount and landed solid on the mat. She waved to the crowd and ran to the outstretched arms of her teammates.

A roar went up. The score was 9.8.

From court one Cissie Donigan watched as her teammates left the courts. Screams erupted from the stands as each Florida player turned in her score.

As Cissie continued her match with collegiate champion Anna Maria Fernandez, she looked at the score. Florida 3, Southern Cal 1.

Cissie's match was tied 4-all in the third set. She'd fought back to take the second set 6-3, after losing the first 1-6. The tension mounted as Cissie pulled out the 6-4 score in the third to upset USC's number one player.

Florida went on to upend the Lady Trojans 8-1 in the quarterfinals of the collegiate championships. USC was the two-time defending champion and had not lost in 66 straight matches.


Florida's Renee Laravie was in lane four. Arizona State's Gail Amundrud was in lane five.

The world of swimming had never seen anything quite like it. The 1979 AIAW swimming championship was down to the last relay. Florida held a slim 10 point lead over Stanford and 11 points over Arizona State and all three teams were in the 400 yard freestyle relay final.

To win the collegiate championship, Florida had to finish no lower than third. The starter cocked his gun. Laravie and Amundrud both had a false start. One more would mean disqualification.

The starter tried again. It was clean. After the first two legs of the relay, it was clear Florida and Arizona State were the best in the pool.

All the Lady Gators had to do was



finish the race without disqualification. Brenda Borgh of Florida touched in second place and the call went up . . . It's great to be a Florida Gator! It's great to be a Florida Gator!

Swimming had seen its closest final — Florida 513, Arizona State 508.

These three instances epitomize the University of Florida's women's athletic program in the last few years. Few schools in the country can boast the continued success the Lady Gators have worked for.

In the 1980-81 season, five of the seven sports finished in the nation's top eight with golf, swimming and tennis also taking Southeastern Conference titles.

The tennis team was the top finisher for Florida with fourth while the Randy Reese-coached swimmers weren't far behind at fifth. Coming in at sixth in the country was gymnastics with softball at seventh and golf at eighth.

Academically, the Florida women sport a 2.86 cummulative grade point average with gymnast Kathy Gordon boasting a Lady Gator high 3.91 in special education.

"We have many advantages other schools do not," said track coach Carol Slowik. "We have a fulltime athletic director and academic counselor that devote their time to the Lady Gator athletes.

"The fact we have those fulltime administrators helps my recruiting," she continued. "Plus we can boast the high caliber of athletes at the University to our recruits and our weather is ideal for athletic participation."

Marilyn Weiss, the assistant athletic director for women's sports,

started her duties at Florida in August and is already pleased with her views of the program.

"We want our athletes to strive for excellence not only in their sport, but also in their academic field. We want to make the people of Gainesville and north central Florida aware of the quality of the women in our sports. I want to see our program continue to grow," she said.

The Lady Gators have many national and international competitors within the ranks. Swimming has a long list of All-Americans and boasts three members of the 1980 Olympic teams in Americans Tracy Caulkins and Megan Neyer and Australian Rosemary Brown.

Hurdler Lori Dinello ranks fourth in American track history in the 50 yard hurdles and seventh in both the 60 yard and 60 meter hurdles.

Golfer Laurie Rinker was the 1980 United States Golf Association's Junior Champion while gymnast Lynn McDonnell, diver Megan Neyer and tennis player Cissie Donigan all participated in the '81 World University Games in Romania.

The Florida women have come a great distance since five sports were formed into the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Program in 1973. The initial sports of golf, gymnastics, swimming, tennis and track have been joined by cross country, basketball and softball and the three scholarships offered in '73 has grown to over 80.

Indeed, the road for intercollegiate athletics for women at the University of Florida seems to be heading for the top of the hill and to the top of collegiate programs nationally.


