



REFRESHMENTS are available on the concourse in the West stands and under the East stands.





Most students begin undergraduate programs in the College of Arts and Sciences and spend their first two years studying a broad range of general education topics before choosing a major area of study.



used to dream of selling out all Cardinal basketball games, which U of L achieved in 1983. Selling out Cardinal Stadium, home of the Cards' football team, has now replaced that dream.

Another major step taken under Olsen's tenure has been the formation of the U of L Athletic Association, with President Donald C. Swain serving as chairman of a 23-member board of directors and Olsen as the executive director. Olsen also spear-headed an extensive campaign to gain U of L admittance in the College Football Association, an elite group of 52 major college football schools.

"Membership in the CFA is the result of an extensive effort in recent years to bring our football program to its highest level," said Olsen. "It reflects on our commitment to football and the response of fans to our efforts to build a quality football program."

Football attendance has increased annually as a result of the complete marketing effort since Olsen became athletic director. The average attendance figure has improved by an average of nearly 9,000 fans per game in his six years at U of L.

A native of Vincennes, Ind., Olsen is a Marine Corp veteran and holds two degrees from U of L — a bachelor's (1962) with honors in Biology, and a master's (1965).

Following his graduation from U of L, Olsen coached basketball at Louisville Westport High School, where he compiled a 125-30 record in seven seasons.

He joined the Cardinal basketball staff in 1969 and soon earned a reputation as one of college basketball's top recruiters. He helped recruit an elite array of talent for the program including Darrell Griffith, Wesley Cox, Roger Burkman, Allen Murphy, Terry Howard, Phil Bond, Derek Smith, Jerry Eaves, Lancaster Gordon, Charles Jones and many others.

In addition to his basketball duties, he served as an assistant athletic director during 1974-75 under Dave Hart.

Married to the former Sharon Williamson of Vincennes, Ind., the Olsens have three children; Doug (19), who plays basketball for the University of Tampa, Lynn (17), and David (9).



MIKE BATUELLO Director of Marketing and Promotions

Mike Batuello, assistant marketing director and an intern in the U of L athletic department for the last three years, is in his first year as director of marketing and promotions.

Batuello coordinates all marketing and promotions functions with the U of L athletic department including the coordination of program advertising and group ticket sales, merchandising and game promotion and marketing.

Batuello, 30, earned his degree in accounting from Indiana in 1978 and is presently working on his master's degree at Western Illinois University in Athletic Administration. Batuello is also a registered CPA in the state of Indiana. He served five years as an auditor with Touche Ross & Co., of Chicago, Ill., before coming to Louisville.

Batuello is active within the university as an adult sponsor of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and helps in Red Barn functions.

A native of Indianapolis, Ind., Batuello is single.

DON BELCHER Associate Athletic Director/ Internal Affairs

For over 19 years Don Belcher has worked within the business and ticket operation of the University of Louisville athletic department. Belcher was recently promoted to Associate Athletic Director of Internal Affairs.

A native of Providence, R.I., Belcher served 20 years in the Navy, qualifying as a paratrooper operating 15 years with the Underwater Demolition Team as a frogman. Following his retirement as a chief petty officer, he joined the Cardinal staff in July of 1967 as a ticket manager, a position he held until becoming business manager in 1983.

A 1974 graduate of U of L, Belcher oversees the budget and finance operations for Cardinal athletics. He attained a master's degree in education from Indiana in 1977.

Active within the University, Belcher served as co-chairman of the internal campaign of the Quest of Excellence program. He is also a member of the U of L Alumni Board of Directors and has been a staff senator in the U of L Staff Senate.

Belcher is married to the former Betty Jean Swann and they have five children: Robert (30), Larry (28), Barbara (25), Sue (24) and Thomas (22).

ROB BRAWNER, JR. Assistant Athletic Director for Operations and Tickets

Rob Brawner is in his initial year on the U of L athletic staff as assistant athletic director for operations and tickets.

Before obtaining his position at U of L, Brawner was the Director of Admission Control for the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center, serving as the KFEC liaison with the Ticketron corporation and operating the KFEC Ticket Office. A native of Springfield, III., Brawner received a B.S. degree from Cincinnati Bible College in 1977. He earned a Master's Degree in Sports Administration from Ohio University in 1985.

Brawner has also served as the Director of Tickets for the Ohio High School class AAA, AA, and A sectional, district and regional basketball tournaments. In 1978-79, he served as an assistant basketball coach at Cincinnati Bible College.

He is married to the former Lori Higgins and they have a son: Chris (2).

BRIAN FAISON Assistant Athletic Director/ Development Executive Director, CAF

In his third year as assistant athletic director for athletic development and Executive Director of the Cardinal Athletic Fund, Brian Faison coordinates activities for all support groups of the athletic program as well as assisting in the development and implementation of all fund-raising and marketing procedures.

Faison, 35, served five years in a similar capacity at Illinois State University. His five years at ISU saw the football and basketball attendance revenues double, and the membership in The Redbird Club increase twofold under his leadership. He began a revenue-producing advertising sales program as well as a student athletic promotions club at Illinois State.





Faison came to ISU from the University of Missouri where he was assistant director for alumni activities after earning his undergraduate degree in political science there in 1972. He is currently completing work on a master's degree in journalism from Missouri.

A native of St. Louis, Faison is married to the former Donna Lee Rice and they have two sons, Jonathan (6) and Matthew (3).

DICK HILL Senior Associate Athletic Director

Dick Hill is in his first year on the Cardinal athletic staff. Hill was formerly the Athletic Director at Southern University where he served for five years. He is primarily responsible for planning, special projects, communication and policy development for the Cardinal athletic department.

Hill has an extensive instructional background. He served on the graduate faculty at Southern University while director of athletics and also taught in the physical education department.

Hill has 27 years of athletic administrative and coaching experience. He earned his doctorate in Physical Education from The State University of New York at Buffalo in 1981. He earned his master's from the University of Buffalo in 1962 after gaining an NCAA Scholar-Athlete Post Graduate award. He earned his B.S. degree in Physical Education at Southern University in 1960.

As a track coach at San Diego St., Southern University and Florida A&M, Hill has coached Olympians and national champions Bob Hayes, Bob Beamon, Edwin Moses, Willie Davenport, Oliver Ford, James King, Wes Williams and Arnie Robinson.

Hill has also coached in international events. He was an assistant coach of the USA-AAU national team which faced China in 1975; the World Cup III in Rome in 1981; and the 1983 Pan American Games. He also coached in the National Sports Festival (1979 and 1981).

A native of Yonkers, N.Y., Hill and his wife Mary have two children: Richard, Jr. (20) and Rosaline (18).

BETTY JACKSON Director of Customer Relations

Betty Jackson has been associated with the University of Louisville ticket operation for over 16 years and she recently was promoted to Director of Customer Relations because of her outstanding customer communications.

Jackson first joined the Cardinal staff in 1969 as a clerk in the U of L ticket office. She assumed the duties of assistant ticket manager under present Associate Athletic Director/ Internal Affairs Don Belcher in 1975, a position she held over eight years before being elevated to ticket manager in 1983.

A native Louisvillian, Jackson was instrumental in major changes of the ticket office. Season ticket sales have increased by over 6,000 fans for basketball and nearly 9,000 for football.

U of L is in its seventh year of computerized ticket distribution through a Ticketron system, which also maintains donor information on season ticket holders. Jackson has also worked in the ticket distribution for two NCAA Regionals and four Metro Conference tournaments which the Cardinals have hosted.

Jackson has three children: Christy (26), David (23) and Terri (22). She also has one granddaughter, Nicole (2).

KENNY KLEIN Sports Information Director Assistant Athletic Director/ Media Relations

Kenny Klein is in his fourth season as sports information director for the University of Louisville.

Klein joined the Cardinal staff in August of 1983, after nearly two seasons as SID at Morehead State University. Prior to that stint, Klein spent four years as an undergraduate and graduate assistant at Murray State University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in Journalism in 1981.

A native of Clarksville, Tenn., Klein (26) also worked one season as a student assistant in sports information and as a sports editor of the student newspaper at Austin Peay State University and was a sports writer for the Clarksville Leaf-Chronicle.

Klein is responsible for a computerized statistics package used for basketball. The

system was used during the 1986 NCAA Championship. In his initial season with the Cardinals, Klein edited the 1983-84 U of L basketball media guide which was judged second in the nation by the College Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and the cover of that book was chosen as the best in the nation. Klein also received four publication awards from CoSIDA while at Murray State. He is married to the former Nancy Mitchener.

KEVIN MILLER Assistant to the Athletic Director for Budget and Finance

Kevin Miller begins his first year with the athletic department this year, but by no means is he a rookie at the University of Louisville. Miller, who worked the past 10 years in the U of L controller's office, was named assistant to the athletic director for budget and finance. He oversees the financial and accounting operation for the U of L Athletic Association.



Coaches — U of L head coach and Schnellenberger (Kentucky '56) in his second season with the anals. The former Louisville Flaget School star and Kentucky allegan has a 45-29 collegiate coaching after six years as head coach in usual e and Miami. He led Miami to the national championship with a 31-20

win over Nebraska in the Orange Bowl. He has also held coaching positions at Kentucky, Alabama, the Los Angeles Rams, Miami Dolphins and Baltimore Colts. Schnellenberger entered the season 23rd on the list of winningest active Division I-A coaches.

Florida State's Bobby Bowden (Samford '53) has compiled a 86-34-3 record at FSU in his 11th year as a head coach. Bowden has an overall record of 159-66-3 from heading coaching positions at Samford (1959-62) West Virginia 1970-75 and Florida State. Bowden entered the season 10th on the list of winningest active Division I-A coaches and sixth on the list of coaches with the most wins.

About the Seminoles — The Seminoles have weathered adversity, tragedy and scheduling enroute to a 3-2-1 record. After a nifty 24-0 shut-out of Toledo, FSU fell 34-17 on the road to Nebraska. Shortly after a tragic incident when one of the Seminole players was shot, the stunned Seminole squad tied North Carolina 10-10 in Tallahassee. Michigan prevailed 20-18 over the 'Noles in Ann Arbor. Since then the Seminoles have gathered themselves together and puton an offensive fireworks display. FSU rolled over Tulane 54-21 and wiped out Wichita 59-3, outscoring their opponents 113 to 24.

Against the Shockers of Wichita, junior quarterback Danny McManus passed for three first-half touchdowns. Junior running back David Palmer and frosh flanker Ronnie Lewis ran for two TD's apiece for FSU which led 52-0 after three periods. McManus, making just his second start of the season, led an offense that produced 295 yards in just the first half. After establishing a solid 38-0 lead, Bowden allowed Peter Tom Willis, Chip Ferguson and Alan Stewart take their turns at the helm.

The Seminole offense is led by Sammie Smith who has rushed 61 times for 340 yards. Victor Floyd has 309 yards on 54 carries. Give the ball to each of these players once and you may have yourself a first down. Each averages just over five yards per carry. Tanner Hollomon and his brother Darrin combined for 409 offensive yards. Herb Gainer has caught 18 passes for 301 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Seminole receiving corps. Kicker Derek Schmidt has been perfect on 21 extra point attempts but is 5-11 in field goals, missing 5 of seven attempts from more than 40 yards out. At quarterback, Ferguson has racked up the most yards (498) but has been picked off five times. McManus, taking over, has completed 62.7 percent of his passes for 448 yards and four touchdowns.

McGowan and Jones: a two-man wrecking crew

Okay, it's Seminole trivia time. Your question for the day — what's "McGowan and Jones"? Your choices are: (a) a new detective series on CBS this fall, (b) a new band specializing in Southern Boogie, (3) the best college middle linebacking tandem in the country.

"Fred Jones is an NFL quality player," Burnham begins. "He plays the run extremely well. In fact, his only real weakness is coverage of backs, on pass plays and he has worked extremely hard this past year on that."

As far as McGowan goes, Burnham says that he may be the best in the country right now. Paul is the ideal in middle linebackers.'

Together, Burnham doubts that there is a college team in the nation that has a better pair. "Individually both players are super," he says. "Together they only make each other better. They communicate well, alerting each other to what's going on . I feel pretty strongly that these two may be the best. Strong enough to say I wouldn't trade for two middle linebackers from any other college team."

With Henry Taylor graduating, an open

starting position was up for grabs. McGowan wasted little time grabbing it.

It took only his second game as a starter to make a name for himself. In a nationally televised game against Nebraska, McGowan was a one-man wrecking crew. He made 10 tackles including two for losses, and added four assists. McGowan's outstanding play led to a 17-13 upset win by Florida State and netted him Sports Illustrated's Defensive Player of the Week, along with similar accolades from the Associated Press.

In 1986, McGowan has been even BETTER. Through four games he had already collected 59 tackles - or an average of 14.75 per game. His statistics 20 tackles vs. Michigan and 18 vs. Nebraska — bear out that the better the opponent, the better McGowan plays.

Jones' rise has been slower. A member of the Orlando Sentinel's "Sweet 16" team as a senior at South Miami High, Jones played sparingly as a freshman — making 18 tackles.

During the next two seasons, Jones earned a starting job and played well. He made 105 tackles as both a sophomore

and a junior and had several outstanding years.

"I let too many things bother me the past couple of seasons," says Jones. But my attitude has changed now — I'm hoping to play every down like it's the most important of my life."

Jones' improvement between the end of last season and the beginning of this year has been remarkable. He was selected as the most improved in his area during spring ball and at almost 15 pounds lighter than last year, has improved his quickness and pass coverage.

His 1986 statistics are sparkling — even though they're not quite the numbers McGowan has put together. He had 42 stops after four games, including two tackles for loss and a quarterback sack.

Both players list making All-American as their goals. But put team success above everything. "If you don't want to play well enough to gain recognition, you probably don't belong out there," Jones says. "Obviously the team comes first. If the entire defense doesn't play well, it would be tough for anyone on that defense to make All-America.'





Gruden has made an immediate impact. The Cardinals have won two of his four starts and had a chance to win the Cincinnati game in the closing minutes. He has thrown for 876 yards during those games while hitting 48 percent of his passes.

The significant given us a new sense of potential for the offensive unit which has stirred the entire group to play even harder," Stimellenberger said.

Gruden stirred up a lot of defenses last year with flashes of brilliance as the Cardinals back-up quarterback. He completed seven of eight passes and led U of L on an 84-yard scoring drive in his college debut at West Virginia.

Gruden saw more playing time later in the season when the U of L offense became stagnant. In the second-to-last game of the season, he replaced Rubbert at the end of the first quarter and exploded for 222 yards passing. Gruden struck again in the season finale against Eastern Kentucky with 232 yards.

By the end of the season, the freshman quarterback had racked up 839 yards while completing a school-record 56.9 percent of his passes.

"In his freshman year he performed better for us than Jim Kelly and Joe Namath and a lot of other quarterbacks I've been associated with," Schnellenberger said earlier this year.

Gruden threw for more yards and completed a higher percentage of passes than both of Schnellenberger's former pupils. Kelly threw for 721 yards and connected on 43 percent of his passes during his first year at Miami (Fla.). Namath completed 49 percent of his attempts for 765 yards at Alabama.

Despite those flattering comparisons and a successful freshman season, Gruden still remained the No. 2 quarterback. He did nothing to improve his situation in this year's opener when he completed five of seven passes at Illinois. You see, three of those completions were to Illini defenders.

But Gruden never lost confidence in himself and neither did his coach.

He got his long-awaited start in the home opener against Western Kentucky and responded with a solid performance. The young man, who spent his early years in Indiana before moving to Florida as a teenager, threw for 257 yards and two touchdowns. More importantly, he led U of L to its first win of the season.

Game No. 2 under Gruden was even better. The Cardinals coasted to a 31-0 half-time lead against Memphis St. The sophomore quarterback hit 19 passes for 272 yards and three touchdowns. None of his 30 attempts were intercepted.

"I was happy with my first two starts," Gruden said. "It (starting the game) is a lot easier because in the first quarter you get to see what the defense is doing. By the middle of the game, you know what they're doing and you have a better feel for the game."

Gruden also said practicing daily with the first team has helped him in the games.

Gruden and the Cardinals took a while to get untracked in his third start against Cincinnati. After missing all three of his first quarter attempts, the sophomore led U of L 53 yards in the final minute of the first half to set up a Danny Cerione field goal.

The Cardinals' two-game winning streak ended at Cincinnati and so did a personal streak for Gruden. He threw an interception in the second quarter breaking a string of 76 straight passes without an interception. Gruden was intercepted twice more by the Bearcats but he reached the 200-yard passing plateau for the fifth time in his brief career.

"I think he's made progress in every football game," Schnellenberger said.


Gruden's football education began at an early age when his father was an assistant coach at Notre Dame. Jim Gruden is now the director of player personnel for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

"He (his father) has shown me the ropes," the younger Gruden said. "I've been around football my whole life. I've seen how top players act on and off the field."

His education must have included lessons in humility also.

"I'm really not great at anything," Gruden said. He also shrugged off the comparisons between him and some of Schnellenberger's former quarterbacks even though Gruden clearly had better freshman statistics.

"Stats don't mean much to me," Gruden said. "It's how the team does. (Jim) Kelly and (Joe) Namath were on great teams. I hope over the next few years we can be successful also."



Head Coach Howard Schnellenberger

When Howard Schnellenberger accepted the job as head coach at the University of Louisville on Dec. 1, 1984, he received some questioning glances from his acquaintances in the sportswriting field.

"About 80 percent thought I may have lost my mind," recalls Schnellenberger. "The other 20 percent weren't sure. Yet I don't think any of them will flat out say we can't get it done at Louisville."

Schnellenberger considered numerous offers to coach in professional football and with more established collegiate programs. But his surprise selection was Louisville.

"We came here because of the challenge," he emphasized. "We had been part of national championships at Alabama and Super Bowl champions in the NFL and then had our own national title at Miami. But Louisville represented something very different - it meant building a program that had never aspired to greatness, never played in a major bowl and never made the commitment to contend for the national title. Had they ever done either of the three before, I would not have accepted the job. I truly believe that when we do challenge for the championship, it will be the top story in college football history."

Part of the construction of a champion has included extensive changes in the facilities. A new locker room, a clubhouse, a new weight room, a new training room are just some of the changes. Ten acres of natural turf practice fields under sprinklers, refurbished offices and meeting rooms are other changes. A renovated dormitory that features a permanent study hall area, meeting rooms, a games room as well as newly carpeted and furnished commons areas that will welcome the football Cardinals home.

"If we are to win the national championship at Louisville, we will need the support of the entire state," said Schnellenberger to those he met on his statewide tour where he represented U of L, the State Department of Education and the American Cancer Society. "When we play other Kentucky teams, fine, we'll have one heck of a battle. But when those teams are playing out-of-state opponents, we'll support them all the way. It will take that kind of unity to elevate football in this state to be the very best. And it will take that special spirit to elevate education and many other factors in the state to levels of national prominence."

Schnellenberger has had experience with some of the football all-time classic construction jobs.

In 1979, he found himself as the new head coach at the University of Miami. That program was near extinction after years of mediocrity. Two years later, the squad won the Peach Bowl. After five years, they defeated then-No. 1 ranked Nebraska in the 50th Anniversary Orange Bowl to earn the national championship. Some call that dramatic 31-30 victory the greatest game in college football history.

After working with legendary Coach Blanton Collier at Kentucky, Schnellenberger was on Bear Bryant's staff at Alabama when that program won three national titles in five years.

Later he joined George Allen's staff with the Los Angeles Rams in 1966 as that team grew into a championship contender.

And then Schnellenberger joined Don Shula with the Miami Dolphins in 1970 as that team developed from an expansion team to the Super Bowl champions. The Dolphins won the '72 Super Bowl and finished with a 17-0 record, still the best



record in NFL history. He returned to the Dolphins after serving as head coach of the Baltimore Colts in 1973 and 1974.

Throughout his career, Schnellenberger has helped develop some of the sport's best players, particularly quarterbacks such as Joe Namath (Alabama), Bob Griese (Miami Dolphins), Jim Kelly and Bernie Kosar (University of Miami).

In high school he played on the same team at legendary Flaget High School with Paul Hornung, who is the only player in Kentucky to win the Heisman Trophy and the only one to be inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame. Schnellenberger graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1956 after earning consensus all-American as an end during the 1955 season.

He is married to the former Beverlee Donnelly of Montreal, Canada, The couple met during Schnellenberger's two-year professional career in the CFL. They have three sons: Stephen (25), Stuart (24) and Timothy (18).


BOB MADDOX Defensive Line

Cardinal Stadium has been the home of the University of Louisville football Cardinals since 1957, but the 35,500-seat facility has been the object of considerable improvement in recent years.

Original renovation on the stadium occurred in 1973 with the addition of the east stands, increasing its seating capacity from 20,600 to 37,500. Additional changes in recent years to accommodate baseball within the stadium reduced the capacity to its present 35,500 seats.

Formerly known as Fairgrounds Stadium, the state-owned facility was reconstructed in 1982 to accommodate the Louisville Redbirds professional baseball team, the St. Louis Cardinals' Triple-A minor league organization.

Among the improvements made on the stadium included new Astroturf playing surface; a computerized scoreboard with a complete message center; additional field lighting; replacement of all seats on the grandstand side (west stands) to modern plastic chairs; and new concession areas and rest rooms.

Media have been working out of a press box constructed in 1982 which overlooks mid-field. A photo deck was added to the lower front of the box in 1985. The other boxes are used for entertainment, coaches and additional media seating.

Louisville football also operates from a football complex, located in the north end zone of the stadium, that was completed in May 1977. The \$1.2 million building houses the football coaching staff, trainers, managers and includes dressing areas, conditioning and weight training areas and a training room. The facility received a \$250,000 face lift in 1985.

The largest crowd to witness a football contest in Cardinal Stadium was a contingent of 36,914 fans that viewed the Louisville-Western Kentucky game last season on Sept. 21, 1985. That crowd broke a mark which had stood for seven years.

The University of Louisville established new season attendance marks in total attendance and average attendance during its 1985 football season.

A total of 165,978 fans flocked to Cardinal Stadium in six U of L home contests, over 21,000 more than last year's all-time record.

The Cardinals have also made noticeable strides in average attendance, a figure that has increased steadily in recent history. U of L drew an average of 27,663

fans per game in 1984, a jump of over 3,500 per game from a year ago. The

Cardinals have produced a growth in attendance each of the last four years.

Miller is MVP (most valuable purse string)

Kevin Miller is a valuable asset to the University of Louisville athletic program. No, he is not the six-foot-tall, 230-pound full-back that Coach Schnellenberger gives the ball on fourth and goal situations. Nor is he the six-foot-nine-inch point guard that Coach Crum turns to in the final seconds of a close contest who will put the game on ice for the Cards. Kevin Miller is neither of these and still his job is an important one. Miller is the Assistant to the Athletic Director for Budget and Finance.

As the Assistant to the Athletic Director for Budget and Finance Miller's duties are many. Miller controls the direct operations of the business and finance office where he handles budget preparation review and control, acts as the signature authority of expenditures that come against the athletic budget, monitors transactions and expenditures against the University of Louisville, the athletic department and NCAA regulations, prepares the tax return for the Athletic Association, and he is currently travelling with the University of Louisville football team acting as a liaison to assure accurate accountability of team expenditures while on the road.

Miller graduated from Western Kentucky University in 1973 with a bachelor's degree in business and afterwards worked two years in a local CPA firm before coming to the University of Louisville. Miller began working in the controllers office at the University in 1976. There he coordinated the activities of the University of Louisville Athletic Association. In 1984, Miller served as the treasurer for the University Credit Union until his appointment in the athletic department in August of 1986.

"The biggest problem I have is containing the budget walls," Miller said. "One of the things I want to do is give the coaches the ability to work with their budgets as long as they are accountable for the bottom line and that they don't overspend it. I want to let them have the responsibility to determine what they need."

Winning a second NCAA title in 1986, the athletic budget has increased about four hundred percent since the first title in 1980. One might think that more money would make Miller's job a bit more difficult.

"Winning our second national championship helps us tremendously because we are able to do more now than then," Miller stated. "More money means a higher budget and that means we are able to give more money to the athletic program and that makes the coaching staffs happier because they are able to do more things."

Although the athletic budget has increased four hundred percent in the last six years all of that money is not given to the athletic program. Almost half of the athletic budget is put into an endowment fund for the university which will help the construction of new buildings and it also makes more scholarships available.

According to Miller, "We seem to get more money available to other things than sports. We are trying to put money away for

two things right now. We have commitments now for the addition to Crawford gym and the new student center. We are trying to expand and so as the facilities expand the non-revenue programs should expand."

Miller enjoys working with the athletic department because a gives him a chance to have the best of both worlds.

"I enjoy athletics, I played ball in high school and I enjoy the athletic environment. Athletics give me a chance to work at what I was trained for but it also gives me a chance to be with the other thing I enjoy, athletics," Miller concluded.

Miller is a native of Lebanon Junction. He is married to the former Betty Close and they have two children, Jennifer and Jeremy.

The School of Dentistry has begun a yearlong celebration of its 100th anniversary.

A kick-off reception for the centennial took place on Aug. 17 at the HSC Plaza. At that event, attended by U of L President Donald Swain and city and county officials, the school also welcomed its incoming class and new dean, Wallace Mann.

Activities planned in coming months include an alumni tailgate party at the U of L vs. Florida State football game on Oct. 25 and a reunion banquet at the Kentucky Dental Association's annual convention in Louisville on April 3-5.

An exhibit on the history of the dental school is now being prepared for display at the Museum of Natural History and Science during Dental Health Month in February.

"The centennial should give everyone a sense of tradition and pride," Mann said. "The school's tradition stems from its identity as the first dental school west of the Alleghenies, and the pride stems from all the advances that have been made here in the last 100 years."

Originally known as Louisville College of Dentistry, the dental school was founded in 1886 and joined U of L in 1918. It moved to its present location on the HSC campus in 1970.
