FLORIDA STATE vs. BOSTON COLLEGE

- Florida State opened its season with the program's first international game in Week 0 against Georgia Tech in Dublin, Ireland, and returns home to host Boston College in Doak Campbell Stadium.
- The Seminoles are 59-18 (.766) all-time in home openers and have won their first home game in each of the last two seasons.
- Florida State, the defending ACC champions, topped the 2024 ACC preseason poll voted on by media at ACC Kickoff. FSU's 16 ACC championships and 10 undefeated ACC seasons since joining the league in 1992 are both tops in the conference in that span.
- The Seminoles have won nine consecutive home games, the 5th-longest active streak in the nation. FSU also ranks 5th in the country with its active streak of seven straight wins in road games.
- Florida State is 23-5 since the start of the 2022 season. The team's 23 total wins and 82.1 winning percentage in that span are the best in the ACC, with the win total ranking 4th nationally and the winning percentage is 6th.
- The Seminoles, who won 10 games in 2022 and 13 games in 2023, are the only team in the ACC and one of just 12 nationally to reach double-digit wins in 2022 and 2023.
- Florida State returns 73 players from last year's ACC championship team, a total that includes nine All-ACC honorees, two All-Americans, two national award semifinalists and the ACC Championship Game MVP.

QUICK HITS

- FSU returns all 11 on-field coaches from last season, the second time in Mike Norvell's FSU tenure his coaching staff remained intact across multiple seasons. Eight of Norvell's 10 assistant coaches have been with the program since his first season in 2020.
- Among the six FBS teams that played Week 0, Florida State posted the highest completion percentage (70.4) and the most 4th-down conversions (2). FSU was the only team in the country to convert a 4th-down attempt in Week 0.
- The Seminoles' pass defense continued to excel in the season opener, leading the six FBS teams that played in Week 0 by allowing 146 yards through the air. Last season, FSU led the country in opponent completion percentage (48.3), pass breakups (80), passes defended (90) and passes defended per game (6.43).
- Florida State's offensive line boasts 345 collegiate games played with 215 starts, both the highest totals in the country. The line includes returning first-team All-ACC offensive tackle Darius Washington, all-conference center Maurice Smith and starting tackle Jeremiah Byers from last year's group that blocked for the ACC's highest-scoring offense for the second straight year.
- FSU earned two ACC Player of the Week recognitions in Week 0 after the conference had three teams start their season on August 24. Shyheim Brown was named the ACC's Defensive Back of the Week after recording a career-high 13 tackles, including 1.0 for loss. His tackles total was the most for a Florida State defensive back since current Carolina Panther Jammie Robinson made 18 stops at Florida in 2021. Kicker Ryan Fitzgerald was named the conference's Specialist of the Week after scoring seven points, courtesy of two field goals and one PAT. He made a career-long 59-yard field goal that is the longest in a conference game in ACC history and third-longest overall by an ACC kicker. His make from 59 yards was six yards longer than his previous career-long and tied the game at 14-14 on the last play of the first half. Additionally, Fitzgerald connected on a 52-yard field goal earlier in the 2nd quarter for his first career game with two field goals of at least 50 yards.

QUARTERBACK



QB #4

DJ UIAGALELEI

- Fifth-year senior DJ Uiagalelei completed 19 of 27 passes for 193 yards and no turnovers in the Aer Lingus Classic to begin the season. He connected on a pair of fourth-down attempts in the fourth quarter while driving FSU to tie the game - on 4th-and-7 for 20 yards to Ja'Khi Douglas and on 4th-and-8 for 19 yards to Malik Benson, setting up FSU's final touchdown.
- Uiagalelei was one of three signal-callers added to the quarterbacks room after ACC

Player of the Year Jordan Travis completed his eligibility, also bringing in true freshmen Luke Kromenhoek and Trever Jackson.

- Uiagalelei, rated as the No. 1 pocket passer in the Class of 2020 out of St. John Bosco High School, has now played in 49 career games with 41 starts. He has thrown for 8,512 yards with 57 touchdowns and added 1,139 rushing yards with 21 additional touchdowns.
- As a true freshman at Clemson, Uiagalelei broke the record for most passing yards

by a Notre Dame opponent after totaling 439 yards on 29 completions at the 4th-ranked Fighting Irish. He left the Tigers ranked in the top-10 in program history for career completions, passing touchdowns, quarterback rushing touchdowns, passing yards and wins as a starting quarterback.

- Uiagalelei is one of three active players nationally with at least 8,000 passing yards and 1,100 rushing yards.

RUNNING BACK

LAWRANCE TOAFILI

- Fifth-year senior Lawrance Toafili scored the first touchdown of the FBS season when he scampered 28 yards for a score on FSU's opening drive of the Aer Lingus Classic. Toafili has now scored 17 total touchdowns as a Seminole - 13 rushing, 4 receiving.
- Toafili's run was FSU's longest of the game; he also accounted for the Noles longest reception of the game, a 21-yarder on FSU's second drive of the season.
- Toafili and Roydell Williams both started for Florida State. Williams, a transfer from Alabama who started for the Crimson Tide in the SEC Championship Game and the CFP Semifinals, led FSU with 38 rushing yards and scored the game-tying touchdown in the fourth quarter on a one-yard run.
- Toafili, who rushed for a career-high 118 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown in last season's ACC Championship Game, is FSU's leading returner in rushing yards and all-purpose yards.
- Among Toafili's 118 rushing yards in the conference championship game was a 73-yard run, the 2nd-longest rush in ACC Championship Game history, in the third quarter to set up the game's only touchdown after Louisville had tied the game.

DEFENSIVE END

PATRICK PAYTON

- Patrick Payton backed up his 2022 ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year season with an all-conference performance in 2023, recording 44 tackles, including a team-high 14.5 for loss with 7.0 sacks, 10 pass breakups, seven quarterback hurries and two forced fumbles. Payton's pass breakups total was the highest by an ACC defensive lineman since 2016 and tied for 4th overall in the ACC in 2023, while his TFLs total ranked 6th in the conference.
- Payton tied his single-game career-high with seven tackles, 2.0 for loss with 1.0 sack, two quarterback hurries and one pass breakup in the ACC Championship Game victory over No. 14 Louisville.

DEFENSIVE TACKLE

JOSHUA FARMER

- Joshua Farmer earned second-team all-conference honors after recording 32 tackles, including 7.0 for loss with 5.0 sacks, two quarterback hurries, two pass breakups and one forced fumble. He started all 13 games he played and produced the highest in rivalry matchups as he made a career-high five tackles, including his career-best 1.5 tackles for loss, in the 31-24 win at Clemson and matched that
- career-high tackles total in a 24-15 win at Florida.
- Farmer is on the watch lists for the Outland Trophy (nation's best interior lineman) and the Nagurski Trophy (best defensive player) to begin the season.
