FLORIDA STATE vs. MEMPHIS

- Florida State hosts Memphis for the middle game of a season-long, three-game homestand. The Seminoles are playing their first non-conference game of 2024 after opening with two ACC games to start a season for the first time since 2003 (excluding 2020).
- Florida State was the only team in the country to open with two conference games and is the only member of a P4 conference to open with two P4 opponents. Of the 48 other P4 teams that played a P4 opponent (or Notre Dame) in their first or second game, 30 played an FCS opponent in the other game.
- Mike Norvell is 9-2 (.818) in his head coaching career coming off an in-season open date. Including season openers, non-Saturday games and bowl games, his teams are 27-11 (.711) with more than seven days to prepare for a game.
- Florida State is 23-6 since the start of the 2022 season. The team's 23 total wins and 73.3 winning percentage in that span are the best in the ACC, with the win total ranking 8th nationally and the winning percentage 10th.
- The Seminoles, who won 10 games in 2022 and 13 games in 2023, are the only team in the ACC and one of just 12 nationally to reach double-digit wins in 2022 and 2023.
- FSU will induct Athletics Hall of Fame class of 2024 this weekend, including Anquan Boldin and Lamarcus Joyner, who won national championships at FSU in 1999 and 2013, respectively. After scoring 21 career touchdowns, the 8th-most in FSU history, Boldin was the 2003 NFL Rookie of the Year, 2015 Walter Payton Man of the Year, a three-time Pro-Bowl selection and won Super Bowl XLVII with the Baltimore Ravens. Joyner was a consensus All-American in 2013 and three-time All-ACC selection. His nine-year NFL career included an appearance in Super Bowl LIII with the Los Angeles Rams.

QUICK HITS

- The Seminoles' pass defense ranks 2nd in the ACC and 20th in the country allowing an average of 126.0 yards per game through the air. Last season, FSU led the country in opponent completion percentage (48.3), pass breakups (80), passes defended (90) and passes defended per game (6.43).
- Florida State's offensive line boasts 366 collegiate games played, the most in the country, with 220 starts, the 2nd-highest total nationally. The line includes returning first-team All-ACC offensive tackle Darius Washington, all-conference center Maurice Smith and starting tackle Jeremiah Byers from last year's group that blocked for the ACC's highest-scoring offense for the second straight year.
- FSU earned two ACC Player of the Week recognitions in Week 0 when the conference had three teams start their season. Shyheim Brown was named the ACC's Defensive Back of the Week after recording a career-high 13 tackles, including 1.0 for loss. His tackles total was the most for a Florida State defensive back since current Carolina Panther Jammie Robinson made 18 stops at Florida in 2021. Kicker Ryan Fitzgerald was named the conference's Specialist of the Week after scoring seven points, courtesy of two field goals and one PAT. He made a career-long 59-yard field goal that is the longest in a conference game in ACC history and third-longest overall by an ACC kicker. His make from 59 yards was six yards longer than his previous career-long and tied the game at 14-14 on the last play of the first half. Additionally, Fitzgerald connected on a 52-yard field goal earlier in the 2nd quarter for his first career game with two field goals of at least 50 yards.
- Florida State punter Alex Mastromanno was named the Ray Guy national Punter of the Week following his performance against Boston College. Mastromanno, one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award last year, averaged 52.2 yards per punt on six attempts with three traveling at least 50 yards, including a career-long-tying 65-yard punt that rolled out of bounds at the 4-yard line. His season average of 49.9 yards per punt is the best in the ACC and 3rd-highest average in the country.

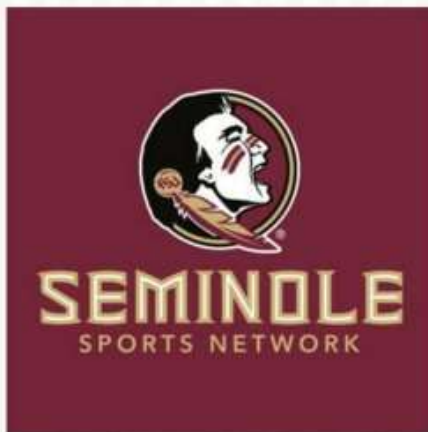

QB #4

DJ UIAGALELEI

- Fifth-year senior DJ Uiagalelei completed 21 passes for 272 yards and a touchdown against Boston College, his seventh career 250-yard passing game. His first passing touchdown as a Seminole went to Kentron Poirier, a 29-yard grab in the third quarter against the Eagles.
- In his FSU debut, Uiagalelei completed 19 of 27 passes for 193 yards and no turnovers in the Aer Lingus Classic to begin the season. He connected on a pair of fourth-down attempts in the fourth quarter while driving FSU to tie the game - on 4th-and-7 for 20 yards to Ja'Khi Douglas and on 4th-and-8 for 19 yards to Malik Benson, setting up FSU's final touchdown.
- Uiagalelei, rated as the No. 1 pocket passer in the Class of 2020 out of St. John Bosco High School, has now played in 50 career games with 42 starts. He has thrown for 8,784 yards with 58 touchdowns and added 1,134 rushing yards with 21 additional touchdowns.
- As a true freshman at Clemson, Uiagalelei broke the record for most passing yards by a Notre Dame opponent after totaling 439 yards on 29 completions at the 4th-ranked Fighting Irish. He left the Tigers ranked in the top-10 in program history for career completions, passing touchdowns, quarterback rushing touchdowns, passing yards and wins as a starting quarterback.
- Uiagalelei is one of three active players nationally with at least 8,000 passing yards and 1,100 rushing yards, and his 9,918 career yards of total offense are fourth in the country.



RB #9

LAWRANCE TOAFILI

- Fifth-year senior Lawrance Toafili scored the first touchdown of the FBS season when he scampered 28 yards for a score on FSU's opening drive of the Aer Lingus Classic. Toafili has now scored 17 total touchdowns as a Seminole - 13 rushing, 4 receiving.
- Toafili's run was FSU's longest of the game; he also accounted for the Noles longest reception of the game, a 21-yarder on FSU's second drive of the season.
- Toafili and Roydell Williams have both started Florida State's first two games of the season. Williams, a transfer from Alabama who started for the Crimson Tide in the SEC Championship Game and the CFP Semifinals, led FSU in rushing yards and scored the game-tying touchdown in the fourth quarter on a one-yard run.
- Toafili, who rushed for a career-high 118 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown in last season's ACC Championship Game, is FSU's leading returner in rushing yards and all-purpose yards.

RYAN FITZPATRICK

- Kicker Ryan Fitzgerald is 4-for-4 on field goal tries to begin the season, including 52- and 59-yarders against Georgia Tech to begin the season. He was the ACC Specialist of the Week in Week 0, his first career weekly honor.
- Both of Fitzgerald's field goals were in the first half vs. the Yellow Jackets; his 59-yarder tied the game at halftime and is the longest made field goal in a conference game in ACC history.
- Fitzgerald's 59-yarder is also the 2nd-longest in FSU history and 3rd-longest in ACC history. He entered 2024 with one career 50-yard field goal - a 53-yarder in 2021.
- Fitzgerald is the third Seminole with multiple 50-yard field goals in a game and the second to do so in the same half.
- Fitzgerald ranks 8th on FSU's career scoring list with 313 points, passing Gary Cismesia with seven points against Boston College. Cismesia's 60-yard field goal at Florida in 2007 is the longest in school history.



P #5

ALEX MASTROMANNO

- Mastromanno was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week after averaging 52.2 yards on six punts against Boston College.
- Mastromanno booted a 65-yard punt that rolled out of bounds at the 4-yard line, matching the longest of his career. He added punts of 59 and 50 yards against the Eagles.
- A second-team All-American and second-team All-ACC selection in 2023, averaged 45.5 yards per punt last season to rank 2nd in the ACC and 15th nationally while also helping FSU rank 3rd in the country with a net punting average of 43.28 yards per punt.
- For his career, Mastromanno ranks 2nd in Florida State history, averaging 43.89 yards per punt.
- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award last season, Mastromanno is on the preseason watch list for the award given to the nation's top punter.

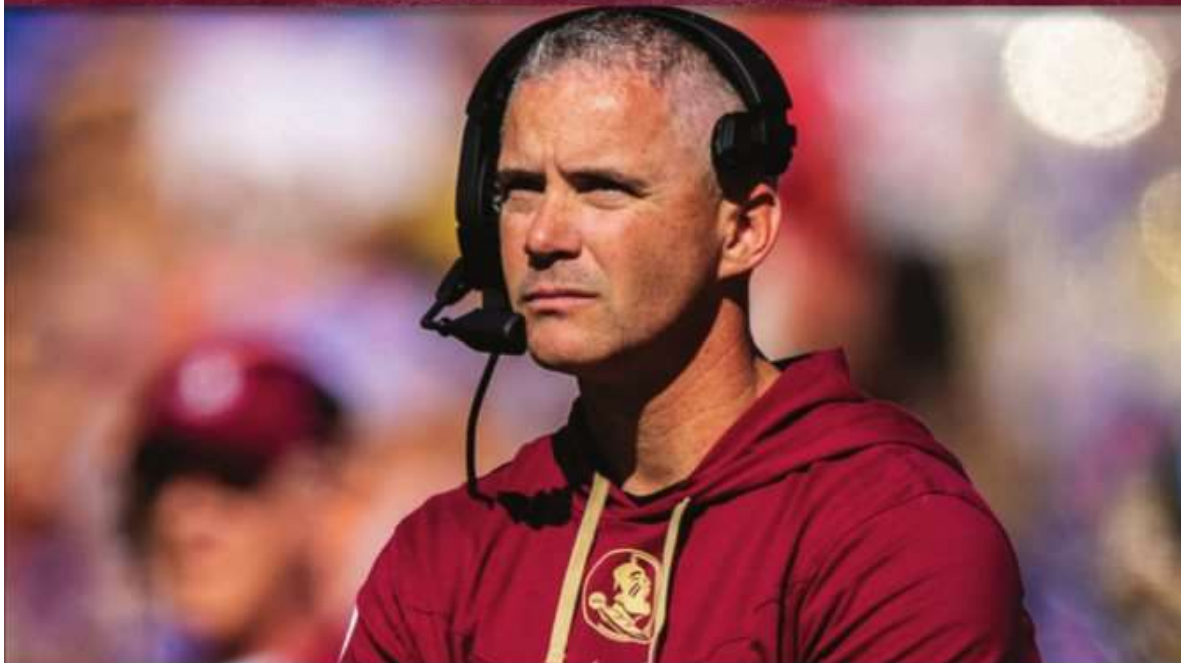
