

FLORIDA STATE vs. CLEMSON

- Florida State plays its fourth home contest in five games this week when it hosts Clemson. In last season's
 matchup at Clemson, the Seminoles ended the Tigers' 25-game ACC home winning streak that was the
 longest active streak in the country with a 31-24 overtime victory at Memorial Stadium.
- Warrick Dunn, who in December will become FSU's 11th College Football Hall of Fame inductee, will be
 recognized with his National Football Foundation On-Campus Salute during Saturday's game. Playing in
 an era before statistics from bowl games counted toward career totals, Dunn became the first player in
 program history to rush for 1,000 yards in three different seasons and left FSU as the program's career
 rushing record holder with 3,959 yards. He still holds school records with 22 career 100-yard rushing games,
 including a school-record streak of six straight 100-yard games in 1995, a single-season yards-per-rush
 average of 7.5 from 1995 and a career average of 6.9 yards per rush.
- Florida State is 24-8 since the start of the 2022 season. The team's 24 total wins and 75.0 winning
 percentage in that span are the best in the ACC, with the win total ranking 11th nationally and the winning
 percentage 13th.
- The Seminoles rank 7th in the nation with two blocked kicks this season, both by Shyheim Brown. The
 redshirt junior blocked a 38-yard field goal vs. Cal and a 27-yard field goal at SMU and is one of three players
 tied for 1st in the country with two blocked kicks this season. Brown, who also blocked the potential gametying PAT with no time left on the clock in Florida State's 24-23 win over LSU at the Superdome in 2022, is
 the sixth player in program history to record multiple career field goal blocks.
- Florida State leads the ACC and ranks 2nd in the country with a net punting average of 47.21 yards per punt.
 Alex Mastromanno's average of 49.8 yards per punt is 1st nationally. Last year, FSU was 3rd in the country in net punting.





QUICK HITS

- Ryan Fitzgerald is one of three kickers in the country with multiple makes from at least 54 yards. He
 is one of four kickers with three 50-yard field goals in 2024 and the sixth kicker in FSU history with at
 least three 50-yard field goals in a single season.
- Florida State registered 7.0 sacks in the win over Cal, its most in a game since also having 7.0 in the 2023 ACC Championship Game and the most allowed by the Bears in a game since October 19, 2019. That sack total is also the most by an ACC team against an FBS opponent this season and tied for the 3rd-highest single-game sacks total nationally in 2024.
- Over the past three games, the Seminoles have combined for 28.0 tackles for loss with 13.0 sacks and three takeaways.
- FSU recorded season-high tackles for loss totals in back-to-back games. The Seminoles registered
 9.0 TFLs against Memphis before making 12.0 TFLs against Cal, the Seminoles' most in a game since
 recording 14.0 TFLs in the 2023 ACC Championship Game win vs. No. 14 Louisville. It was the most
 TFLs allowed by Memphis since December 27, 2022, and most allowed by Cal in 2024.
- Florida State did not allow a tackle for loss on a running play at SMU, the Seminoles' first game
 without a negative-yard rushing play since October 14, 2023, vs. Syracuse. FSU started the same
 five offensive linemen in back-to-back games for the first time this season. Eight different offensive
 linemen made at least one start through the season's first four games, matching last year's 14-game
 total.
- Six Florida State players have made their first collegiate start in 2024. Linebacker Blake Nichelson
 has started each of the last four games, while offensive lineman Jaylen Early has started three
 consecutive contests. Defensive back K.J. Kirkland started vs. Memphis and vs. Cal, and wide receiver
 Hykeem Williams started vs. Cal and at SMU. Tight ends Brian Courtney and Jackson West made their
 first career starts vs. Memphis.

ALEX MASTROMANNO

- For the fifth consecutive season, Ryan Fitzgerald and punter Alex Mastromanno highlight Florida State's special teams unit.
- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award last season, Mastromanno leads the country with a 49.8 yards per punt average in 2024.
- · Mastromanno was named the Ray
- Guy Award Punter of the Week after averaging 52.2 yards on six punts against Boston College.
- Against California, Mastromanno averaged 49.7 yards on six punts, including two 56-yarders, a 52-yarder and a 40-yarder that was downed at the 2-yard line. The Bears' average starting field position on Mastromanno's punts was their own 22-yard line.
- Four of Mastromanno's six punts at SMU traveled 50 yards. For the year, half of his punts (12 of 24) have gone 50 yards or longer,
- A second-team All-American and second-team All-ACC selection in 2023, Mastromanno ranks 1st in Florida State history, averaging 44.29 yards per punt in his career.



K #88 RYAN FITZGERALD

- Kicker Ryan Fitzgerald is one of four kickers with three 50-yard field goals this season, most recently a 54-yarder vs. Memphis that was the 50th 50-yard field goal in FSU history. He is a perfect 6-for-6 on field goal tries to begin the season, including 52- and 59-yarders against Georgia Tech to begin the season. He was the ACC Specialist of the Week in Week Q, his first career weekly honor,
 Roth of Eitzgerald's field east week in the
- Both of Fitzgerald's field goals were in the first haif vs. the Yellow Jackets; his 59-yarder
- tied the game at halftime and is the longest made field goal in a conference game in ACC history.
- Fitzgeräid's 59-yarder is also the 2nd-longest in FSU history and 3rd-longest in ACC history. He entered 2024 with one career 50-yard field goal - a 53-yarder in 2021.
- Fitzgerald is the third Seminole with multiple 50-yard field goals in a game and the second to do so in the same half. He is the sixth Note
- with three 50-yard field goals in a season and the first with multiple 54-yard field goals.
- Fitzgerald's 54-yard field goal against Memphis was fied for the 5th-longest in Doak Campbell Stadium.
- Fitzgerald ranks 8th on FSU's career scoring list with 323 points, passing Gary Cismesia with seven points against Boston College. Cismesia's 60-yard field goal at Florida in 2007 is the longest in school history.

PATRICK PAYTON

- Florida State notched 7.0 sacks and 12.0 tackles for loss in the win vs. Cal, both season-highs. The 7.0 sacks are one shy of the national single-game high in 2024 and match the most for a Mike Norvellcoached team.
- Patrick Payton was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week after setting career-highs with 3.0 sacks and 3.5 TFL, all in the second half. Joshua
- Farmer added 1.0 sack and a career-best 3.5 TFL, while transfer Marvin Jones Jr, had 2.0 sacks, both on Cal's final drive of the game.
- Payton's 3.0 sacks are also one shy of the national single-game high this year.
 Payton leads active Noles with 26.0 TFL and 16.0 sacks in his career. With 0.5 sacks at SMU, Farmer is 2nd with 19.5 TFL and 9.5 sacks.
- FSU allowed just 65 rushing yards against Memphis, the 3rd-best rush defense performance for the Seminoles under Norvell.
- FSU had 9.0 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks against the Tigers, with Farmer and Payton recording their first sacks of the year.

WIDE RECEIVER



WR #0 JA'KHI DOUGLAS

- Fifth-year Nole Ja'Khi Douglas led FSU with 86 yards on four catches against California, including the game-winning 36-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. He leads FSU with 285 receiving yards and also led the Noles in yards against Georgia Tech (55, including a 20yard catch on 4th-and-7) and at SMU (61, including a season-long
- 50-yard catch).
- Douglac caught three passes all on third down - for 70 yards on FSU's game-winning TD drive against the Golden Bears. He converted a 3rdand-18 with a 27-yard catch, picked up seven yards on a 3rd-and-8 that led to a 4th-down conversion, and his 36-yard touchdown was on 3rd-
- and-7.
- Douglas added a team-best four catches for 66 yards against Boston College, including a 30-yard catch, Kentron Poitier caught fwo 29-yard passes and Jaylin Lucas Douglas's brother caught a 25-yard pass from DJ Uiagalelei against Boston College.






