FLORIDA STATE vs. NORTH CAROLINA

- Florida State returns home for its ACC finale against North Carolina on Saturday afternoon. FSU is the first team in the country to play its entire conference schedule and is the only team to play a conference opponent in eight of its first nine games in 2024.
- The Seminoles have won eight straight games in November after posting perfect 4-0 records in both 2022 and 2023, improving head coach Mike Norvell's career record in the final month of the regular season to 24-5 (.828)
- Florida State is the only team in the ACC and one of two nationally with a kickoff return touchdown in each of the last three seasons. Samuel Singleton Jr., extended FSU's streak to three straight years with a 95-yard kickoff return touchdown to open the second half at Duke. Last year, Deuce Spann had a 99-yard kickoff return touchdown at home against the Blue Devils, and in 2022 Trey Benson recorded FSU's first kickoff return touchdown since the 2013 season when he returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a score against Boston College.
- The Seminoles are tied for 1st in the nation with five blocked kicks this season, courtesy of four field goals and one punt block, after blocking one field goal vs. Cal, one at SMU and two vs. Clemson and adding a punt block at Duke. Florida State is one of only two teams in the country to block at least one kick in four different games against FBS opponents, and its four-game streak with at least one blocked kick between the SMU and Duke games is the longest nationally this season. FSU's 14 blocked kicks under Mike Norvell are tied for 6th nationally and tied for 2nd among P4 conference programs since the start of the 2020 season.
- Florida State ranks 1st in the country with a net punting average of 46.58 yards per punt. Alex Mastromanno's average of 49.6 yards per punt is 1st nationally, and Mastromanno also leads the country in 50+-yard punts with 21. He has by far the most 50-yard punts with one or fewer touchbacks this season as the next-closest punter has 15.

QUICK HITS

- Ryan Fitzgerald is the only kicker in the country with four made field goals from at least 52 yards. He is one of five kickers with four 50-yard field goals in 2024 and the third kicker in FSU history with at least four 50-yard field goals in a single season. He's one of five kickers nationally still perfect on field-goals with at least nine attempts this season.
- Florida State held Duke to 70 passing yards, recording a season-high eight pass breakups, and 180 yards of total offense. The passing yards total is the fewest allowed by an ACC team against a P4 conference opponent this season, and the Seminoles' pass breakups total was their highest since registering 10 in the 2023 ACC Championship Game victory.
- Florida State registered 7.0 sacks in the win over Cal, its most in a game since also having 7.0 in the 2023 ACC Championship Game and the most allowed by the Bears in a game since October 19, 2019. That sack total is also the 2nd-most by an ACC team against an FBS opponent this season and tied for the 9th-highest single-game sacks total nationally in 2024.
- Ten Florida State players have made their first collegiate start in 2024. Linebacker Blake Nichelson has started five games, and wide receiver Hykeem Williams has made five consecutive starts. Defensive back K.J. Kirkland has started five of the last six games, and offensive lineman Jaylen Early has also started five games this season. Tight end Landen Thomas has started three straight games. Offensive lineman André Otto made his first start vs. Clemson and started again at Duke. Linebacker Justin Cryer made his first two career starts at Duke and at Miami. Wide receiver Jalen Brown started the first two games of the season, while tight ends Brian Courtney and Jackson West made their first career starts vs. Memphis.

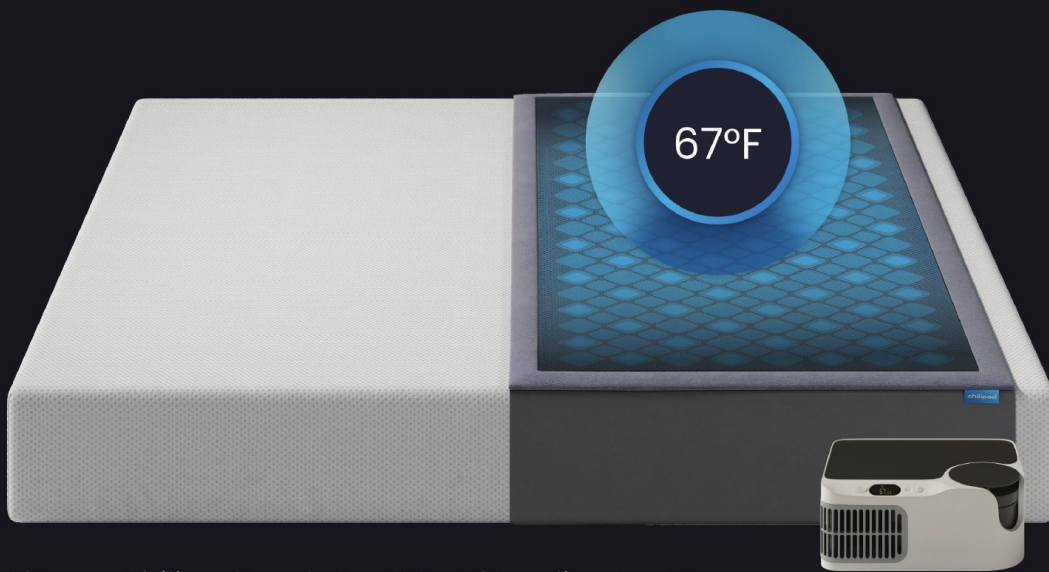

ALEX MASTROMANNO

- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award last season, Alex Mastromanno leads the country with a 49.6 yards per punt average in 2024, nearly a yard better than No. 2 (48.8) and almost three yards better than No. 3 (46.8).
- Over the past two games - at Duke and at Miami - Mastromanno averaged 51.0 yards on seven punts, with a long of 56 against the Hurricanes. Five of his seven punts in those games traveled over 50 yards.
- Mastromanno matched his career-high with four 50-yard punts against SMU and Clemson. For the year, over half (21 of 38) of his punts have gone 50 yards or longer with only one touchback, six more 50-yard punts than the next-closest punter nationally with one or fewer touchbacks.
- Mastromanno was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week after averaging 52.2 yards on six punts against Boston College. He was a Ray's 8 recipient following games against BC, Cal and Duke.
- Against California, Mastromanno averaged 49.7 yards on six punts, including two 56-yarders, a 52-yarder and a 40-yarder that was downed at the 2-yard line. The Bears' average starting field position on Mastromanno's punts was their own 22-yard line.
- A second-team All-American and second-team All-ACC selection in 2023, Mastromanno ranks 1st in Florida State history with a 44.59 career yards-per-punt average and 10,478 career punt yards.

RYAN FITZGERALD

- Ryan Fitzgerald is tied for 3rd nationally with four 50-yard field goals, one shy of FSU's single-season record (5, Dustin Hopkins, 2012; Graham Gano, 2008).
- Fitzgerald's five career 50-yard field goals are tied for 3rd in FSU history, behind Hopkins' nine and Derek Schmidt's seven.
- Fitzgerald made a 53-yard field goal at Duke to improve to 4-for-4 from 50 yards on the season. Fitzgerald tied a career-high with three field goals made against the Blue Devils and is now 9-for-9 on the season.
- Fitzgerald previously had a 54-yard field goal vs. Memphis and a 52- and 59-yard field goal in the first half vs. Georgia Tech.
- His 59-yarder tied the game at halftime and is the longest made field goal in a conference game in ACC history.
- Fitzgerald's 59-yarder is also the 2nd-longest in FSU history and 3rd-longest in ACC history. He entered 2024 with one career 50-yard field goal - a 53-yarder in 2021.
- Fitzgerald is the third Seminole with multiple 50-yard field goals in a game and the second to do so in the same half. He is the first Nole with multiple 54-yard field goals in a season.
- Fitzgerald's 54-yard field goal against Memphis was tied for the 5th-longest in Doak Campbell Stadium.
- At Miami, Fitzgerald was 2-for-2 on PAT and is now tied with Schmidt and Xavier Beitia for 4th in FSU history with 174 career made PAT.
- Fitzgerald ranks 5th on FSU's career scoring list with 336 points. With 10 points at Duke, Fitzgerald broke a tie with two-time Lou Groza Award winner Sebastian Janikowski (324) and passed Scott Bentley (327) and Ricky Aguayo (329).



WR #0

JA'KHI DOUGLAS

- Fifth-year Nole Ja'Khi Douglas leads Florida State with 23 catches, 383 receiving yards and two touchdowns. He caught a 12-yard touchdown vs. Clemson and leads FSU's active roster with seven career TD catches.
- Douglas led FSU with 86 yards on four catches against California, including the game-winning 36-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. He also led the Noles in receiving yards at SMU (season-long 50-yard catch), Duke and Miami.
- Douglas caught three passes - all on third down - for 70 yards on FSU's game-winning TD drive against the Golden Bears. He converted a 3rd-and-18 with a 27-yard catch, picked up seven yards on a 3rd-and-8 that led to a 4th-down conversion, and his 36-yard touchdown was on 3rd-and-7.
- Douglas added a team-best four catches for 66 yards against Boston College, including a 30-yard catch. Kentron Poitier caught two 29-yard passes and Jaylin Lucas - Douglas's brother - caught a 25-yard pass.

OMAR GRAHAM JR.

- Omar Graham Jr. has started four games in 2024, including three straight. At Miami, Graham had three tackles, including the first solo sack of his career. He also broke up a pass in the end zone just before halftime that resulted in a Miami field goal; his three PBU on the season lead FSU's linebackers.
- Graham set a career high with eight tackles against No. 15 Clemson and had a pass breakup for the second consecutive week.
