## FLORIDA STATE vs. CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

- Florida State returns to action after an open date to host Charleston Southern for FSU's annual Seminole Heritage game and the university's Homecoming. Florida State celebrates its long-standing relationship with the Seminole Tribe of Florida by featuring turquoise - the color that represents harmony, friendship and fellowship throughout Native American communities - in many different ways during the game. Last season's 38-20 win over No. 16 Duke was the first Seminole Heritage football game.
- FSU is 61-12-1 (.831) all-time in Homecoming games and has won 10 consecutive Homecoming contests.
- Alex Mastromanno's average of 48.9 yards per punt is 1st nationally, and Mastromanno also leads the country in 50+-yard punts with 26. He has by far the most 50-yard punts with one or fewer touchbacks this season as the next-closest punter has 18. Florida State ranks 2nd in the country and 1st in the ACC with a net punting average of 45.24 yards per punt.
- Ryan Fitzgerald is the only kicker in the country with five made field goals from at least 52 yards - converting from 59, 56, 54, 53 and 52 yards this season - and the only kicker in FSU history to make three career field goals from at least 54 yards. He has matched the FSU single-season record with five 50-yard field goals and is one of four kickers nationally with five 50-yard field goals in 2024. He's one of two kickers in the nation, and the only one in the ACC, still perfect on field goals with at least 10 attempts this season.
- The Seminoles are tied for 2nd in the nation with five blocked kicks this season, courtesy of four field goals and one punt block, after blocking one field goal vs. Cal, one at SMU and two vs. Clemson and adding a punt block at Duke. Florida State is one of only two teams in the country to block at least one kick in four different games against P4 conference opponents, and its four-game streak with at least one blocked kick between the SMU and Duke games is the longest nationally this season. FSU's 14 blocked kicks under Mike Norvell are tied for 7th nationally and 2nd among P4 conference programs since the start of the 2020 season.

## QUICK HITS

- Florida State ranks 1st in the ACC and tied for 3rd nationally with 19 successful 4th-down conversions this season. The Seminoles have converted at least one 4th down in nine games this year, including a 7-yard pass from Brock Glenn to Kyle Morlock to extend a drive that resulted in a field goal at Notre Dame. FSU converted four 4th-down attempts against both Clemson and Miami and is one of two P4 conference teams with at least four 4th-down conversions in multiple games this season.
- Florida State is the only team in the ACC and one of two nationally with a kickoff return touchdown in each of the last three seasons. Samuel Singleton Jr., extended FSU's streak to three straight years with a 95-yard kickoff return touchdown to open the second half at Duke. Last year, Deuce Spann had a 99-yard kickoff return touchdown at home against the Blue Devils, and in 2022 Trey Benson recorded FSU's first kickoff return touchdown since the 2013 season when he returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a score against Boston College.
- FSU has started nine different offensive line combinations through 10 games this season, the most in the country in 2024 and the most by Florida State since at least 2000. Ten offensive linemen have made at least one start, the most for FSU in one season since 2019. Last year, in 14 games, Florida State started four offensive line combinations and eight different offensive linemen.
- Florida State held Duke to 70 passing yards, recording a season-high eight pass breakups, and 180 yards of total offense. The passing yards total is the 2nd-fewest allowed by an ACC team against a P4 conference opponent this season, and the Seminoles' pass breakups total was their highest since registering 10 in the 2023 ACC Championship Game victory.
- The Seminoles registered 7.0 sacks in the win over Cal, its most in a game since also having 7.0 in the 2023 ACC Championship Game and the most allowed by the Bears in a game since October 19, 2019. That sack total is also tied for the 3rd-most by an ACC team against an FBS opponent this season and for the 12th-highest single-game sacks total nationally in 2024.

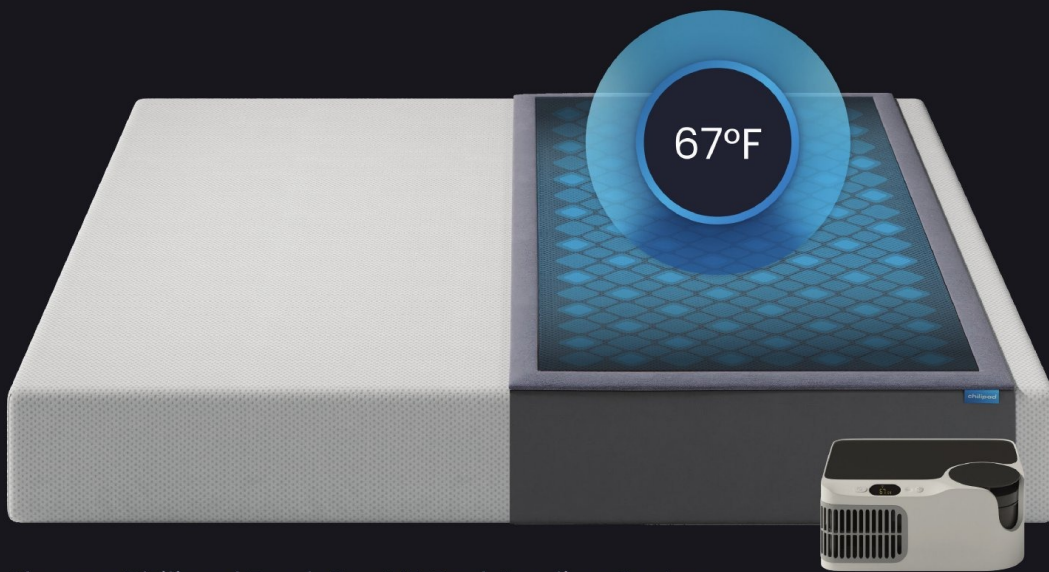
## ALEX MASTROMANNO

- For the fifth consecutive season, punter Alex Mastromanno and kicker Ryan Fitzgerald highlight Florida State's special teams unit.
- Florida State's first finalist for the Ray Guy Award last season, Mastromanno is a semifinalist in 2024 and leads the country with a 48.9 yards-per-punt average in 2024, over a yard better than No. 2 (47.7) and three yards better than the next-best ACC punter (45.9).
- At Duke and at Miami, Mastromanno combined to average 51.0 yards on seven punts, with a long of 56 against the Hurricanes. Five of his seven punts in those games traveled over 50 yards.
- Mastromanno matched his career-high with four 50-yard punts against SMU and Clemson. For the year, over half (26 of 48) of his punts have gone 50 yards or longer with only one touchback, six more 50-yard punts than the next-closest punter nationally and eight more than the next-closest punter nationally with one or fewer touchbacks.
- Mastromanno was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week after averaging 52.2 yards on six punts against Boston College. He was a Ray's 8 recipient following games against BC, Cal, Duke and Miami.
- Against California, Mastromanno averaged 49.7 yards on six punts, including two 56-yarders, a 52-yarder and a 40-yarder that was downed at the 2-yard line. The Bears' average starting field position on Mastromanno's punts was their own
- A second-team All-American and second-team All-ACC selection in 2023, Mastromanno ranks 1st in Florida State career history with a 44.66 yards-per-punt average, 10,941 punt yards and 245 punts.

# RYAN FITZGERALD

- Fitzgerald is 11-for-11 on field goals this season, joining Roberto Aguayo in 2013 and 2014 as the only Seminoles to connect on their first 11 field goal attempts of the season.
- Nationally, Fitzgerald is one of three qualifying kickers still perfect on the season.
- Fitzgerald is 5-for-5 from 50+, one of four kickers in the country with five 50-yard field goals and one of two with at least five attempts that is perfect from that distance. He made a 56-yard field goal against North Carolina to tie Dustin Hopkins (2012) and Graham Gano (2008) for the most 50-yard field goals in a season at FSU.
- Fitzgerald's 56-yard field goal matched the longest for a Seminole in Doak Campbell Stadium's 75-year history.
- Fitzgerald's six career 50-yard field goals are 3rd in FSU history, behind Hopkins' nine and Derek Schmidt's seven.
- Fitzgerald tied a career-high with three field goals made against the Blue Devils, including a 53-yarder.
- Fitzgerald previously had a 54-yard field goal vs. Memphis and 52- and 59-yard field goals in the first half vs. Georgia Tech.
- His 59-yarder tied the game at halftime and is the longest made field goal in a conference game in ACC history.
- Fitzgerald's 59-yarder is also the 2nd-longest in FSU history and 3rd-longest in ACC history. He entered 2024 with one career 50-yard field goal - a 53-yarder in 2021.
- Fitzgerald is the third Seminole with multiple 50-yard field goals in a game and the second to do so in the same half. He is the only Nole with multiple 54-yard field goals in a season and with three in a career.
- At the time, Fitzgerald's 54-yard field goal against Memphis was tied for the 5th-longest in Doak Campbell Stadium.
- At Miami, Fitzgerald was 2-for-2 on PAT and is now tied with Schmidt and Xavier Beltia for 4th in FSU history with 174 career made PAT. Fitzgerald's 56 career made field goals are 7th in program history.
- Fitzgerald ranks 5th on FSU's career scoring list with 342 points. With 10 points at Duke, Fitzgerald broke a tie with two-time Lou Groza Award winner Sebastian Janikowski (324) and passed Scott Bentley (327) and Ricky Aguayo (329).

## BROCK GLENN

- Redshirt freshman Brock Glenn made his third career start - and first in Doak Campbell Stadium - against No. 15 Clemson. He became the fourth player in the Playoff Era (since 2014) to make his first three career starts at QB all against top-15 opponents (per ESPN Stats & Info).
- Glenn set career highs with 23 completions, 228 yards and two touchdown passes. He also scrambled for a 10-yard gain on 4th-and-9, one of FSU's four fourth-down conversions in the game.
- Glenn's touchdown passes went to tight end Amaree Williams and wide receiver Ja'Khi Douglas. Glenn and Douglas connected for another touchdown against North Carolina.
- At Duke, Glenn ran for a career-high 47 yards in his fourth collegiate start. He threw a five-yard touchdown pass to Malik Benson at Miami.
- True freshman Luke Kromenhoek made his collegiate debut against the Blue Devils, completing three passes for 19 yards. His 90.5 passing grade from PFF was the highest in the country in Week 8 for players that attempted at least five passes.
- At Miami, Kromenhoek completed six passes for 61 yards, including a career-long 29-yarder to Douglas. On the ground, Kromenhoek ran for 71 yards.

## AZAREYE'H THOMAS

- Seven Seminoles combined for a season-high eight pass breakups at Duke, including five in the first quarter. FSU's previous high in a game this year was five vs. Memphis. FSU held the Blue Devils to 70 passing yards, the 2nd-fewest by an ACC team against a P4 opponent this season, and 180 total yards. Duke QB Maalik Murphy had thrown for 200 yards in six consecutive games, the 3rd-longest streak in Duke history.
- Azareye'h Thomas set a career high with six tackles at SMU, including five in the first half. He added six tackles against North Carolina and his two pass breakups at Notre Dame tied a career high (vs. LSU, 2023).
- Redshirt freshman K.J. Kirkland made his first career start against Memphis and recorded a game-high nine tackles. He entered the contest with four tackles in seven prior games played. At SMU, Kirkland added six tackles and his first career pass breakup.
- Senior Kevin Knowles II had four tackles and one pass breakup at Duke. At Notre Dame, Knowles got to the QB for his first career sack. For his career, Knowles has 112 career tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss.
