## FLORIDA STATE vs. FLORIDA

- Florida State wraps up its 2024 season by hosting in-state rival Florida on Saturday night. The Seminoles and Gators first played in Tallahassee in 1964, and the all-time series is tied 14-14-1 in games played in the state capitol including a 45-38 FSU win in 2022.
- FSU ranks 1st in ESPN's Special Teams Efficiency rankings with an efficiency rating of 78.4, nearly six points higher than the country's 2nd-ranked team (Vanderbilt, 72.8) and 12.5 points higher than the No. 2 ACC team (Stanford, 65.9).
- Alex Mastromanno's average of 49.1 yards per punt is 1st nationally, and Mastromanno also leads the country in 50+-yard punts with 28. He has by far the most 50-yard punts with one or fewer touchbacks this season as the next-closest punter has 19. Florida State ranks 2nd in the country and 1st in the ACC with a net punting average of 45.25 yards per punt.
- Ryan Fitzgerald is the only kicker in the nation still perfect on field goals with at least 12 attempts this season. He is also one of three kickers in the country with five made field goals from at least 52 yards - converting from 59, 56, 54, 53 and 52 yards this season - and the only kicker in FSU history to make three career field goals from at least 54 yards. He has matched the FSU single-season record with five 50-yard field goals and is one of five kickers nationally with five 50-yard field goals in 2024.
- Florida State is the only team in the ACC and one of two nationally with a kickoff return touchdown in each of the last three seasons. Samuel Singleton Jr., extended FSU's streak to three straight years with a 95-yard kickoff return touchdown to open the second half at Duke. Last year, Deuce Spann had a 99-yard kickoff return touchdown at home against the Blue Devils, and in 2022 Trey Benson recorded FSU's first kickoff return touchdown since the 2013 season when he returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a score against Boston College.
- Luke Kromenhoek made his first collegiate start in last week's win and was 13-of-20 passing for 209 yards with three touchdowns while adding 31 rushing yards. Kromenhoek is the only true freshman in FSU history to pass for three touchdowns in his first start, and his 71-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Khi Douglas on the first play of the second half is the 2nd-longest completion by a true freshman in program history and longest by an FSU true freshman since 1976.

## QUICK HITS

- The Seminoles are tied for 3rd in the nation with five blocked kicks this season, courtesy of four field goals and one punt block, after blocking one field goal vs. Cal, one at SMU and two vs. Clemson and adding a punt block at Duke. Florida State is one of only two teams in the country to block at least one kick in four different games against P4 conference opponents, and its four-game streak with at least one blocked kick between the SMU and Duke games is the longest nationally this season. FSU's 14 blocked kicks under Mike Norvell are tied for 7th nationally and 2nd among P4 conference programs since the start of the 2020 season.
- Florida State is tied for 7th nationally with 19 successful 4th-down conversions this season. The Seminoles have converted at least one 4th down in nine games this year, including a 7-yard pass from Brock Glenn to Kyle Morlock to extend a drive that resulted in a field goal at Notre Dame. FSU converted four 4th-down attempts against both Clemson and Miami and is one of three P4 conference teams with at least four 4th-down conversions in multiple games this season.
- FSU has started nine different offensive line combinations through 11 games this season, the most in the country in 2024 and the most by Florida State since at least 2000. Ten offensive linemen have made at least one start, the most for FSU in one season since 2019. Last year, in 14 games, Florida State started four offensive line combinations and eight different offensive linemen.
- Florida State's 2024 schedule is ranked as the 5th-toughest in the nation according to the NCAA. FSU's opponents have a cumulative .678 winning percentage.

## ALEX MASTROMANNO

- Florida State's first finalist for the Ray Guy Award last season, Alex Mastromanno is a semifinalist in 2024 and leads the country with a 49.1 yards-per-punt average in 2024, over three yards better than the next-best ACC punter (45.6).
- At Duke and at Miami, Mastromanno combined to average 51.0 yards on seven punts, with a long of 56 against the Hurricanes. Five of his seven punts in those games traveled over 50 yards. Both of his punts against Charleston Southern went 50+.
- Mastromanno matched his career-high with four

50-yard punts against SMU and Clemson. For the year, over half (28 of 50) of his punts have gone 50 yards or longer with only one touchback, seven more 50-yard punts than the next-closest punter nationally and nine more than the next-closest punter nationally with one or fewer touchbacks.

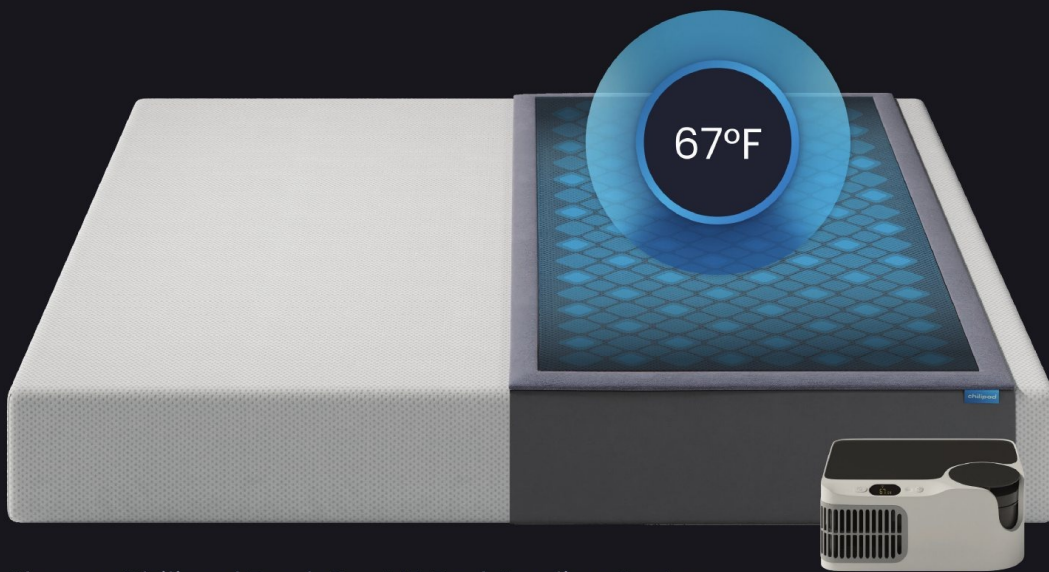
- Mastromanno was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week after averaging 52.2 yards on six punts against Boston College. He was a Ray's 8 recipient following games against BC, Cal, Duke and Miami.

- Against California, Mastromanno averaged 49.7 yards on six punts, including two 56-yarders, a 52-yarder and a 40-yarder that was downed at the 2-yard line. The Bears' average starting field position on Mastromanno's punts was their own 22-yard line.
- A second-team All-American and second-team All-ACC selection in 2023, Mastromanno ranks 1st in Florida State career history with a 44.72 yards-per-punt average, 11,047 punt yards and 247 punts. He also tied the career games played record at 58 against Charleston Southern.

## RYAN FITZGERALD

- Ryan Fitzgerald is a Groza Award semifinalist for the second consecutive season. He is 12-for-12 on field goals this season, the most attempts in the country without a miss. He joins Roberto Aguayo in 2013 and 2014 as the only Seminoles to connect on their first 12 field goal attempts of the season.
- Fitzgerald is 5-for-5 from 50+, one of five kickers in the country with five 50-yard field goals and one of two with at least five attempts that is perfect from that distance. He made a 56-yard field goal against North Carolina to tie Dustin Hopkins (2012) and Graham Gano (2008) for the most 50-yard field goals in a season at FSU.
- Fitzgerald's 56-yard field goal matched the longest for a Seminole in Doak Campbell Stadium's 75-year history.
- Fitzgerald's six career 50-yard field goals are 3rd in FSU history, behind Hopkins' nine and Derek Schmidt's seven.
- Fitzgerald tied a career-high with three field goals made against the Blue Devils, including a 53-yarder.
- Fitzgerald previously had a 54-yard field goal vs. Memphis and 52- and 59-yard field goals in the first half vs. Georgia Tech.
- His 59-yarder tied the game at halftime and is the longest made field goal in a conference game in ACC history.
- Fitzgerald's 59-yarder is also the 2nd-longest in FSU history and 3rd-longest in ACC history. He entered 2024 with one career 50-yard field goal - a 53-yarder in 2021.
- Fitzgerald is the third Seminole with multiple 50-yard field goals in a game and the second to do so in the same half. He is the only Nole with multiple 54-yard field goals in a season and with three in a career.

## LUKE KROMENHOEK

- True freshman QB Luke Kromenhoek was 13-for-20 for 209 yards and three touchdowns in his first career start against Charleston Southern. His three passing touchdowns are the most for a true freshman in his first career start in FSU history.
- Kromenhoek's 71-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Khi Douglas was the 2nd-longest pass for a true freshman in FSU history, FSU's longest offensive play of the year and Douglas' longest career catch.
- Kromenhoek also connected with Amaree Williams (4 yards) and Hykeem Williams (10 yards) for touchdowns. His three touchdowns were the first of his career.
- Kromenhoek made his collegiate debut against Duke, completing three passes for 19 yards. His 90.5 passing grade from PFF was the highest in the country in Week 8 for players that attempted at least five passes.
- At Miami, Kromenhoek completed six passes for 61 yards, including a career-long 29-yarder to Douglas. On the ground, Kromenhoek ran for 71 yards.
- On FSU's first TD drive against the Hurricanes, Kromenhoek had runs of 12 yards, 14 yards (on 3rd-and-10) and 42 yards (on 4th-and-1). Kromenhoek's 42-yard run is FSU's longest of the season.

## JA'KHI DOUGLAS

- Fifth-year Nole Ja'khi Douglas leads Florida State with 28 catches, 486 receiving yards and four touchdowns. He caught a 71-yard touchdown on the first play after halftime against Charleston Southern and leads FSU's active roster with nine career TD catches.
- Douglas led FSU with 82 yards against the Buccaneers and his 71-yard touchdown catch was the longest reception of his career. He passed 1,500 career all-purpose yards on the play and will enter his Florida State finale against Florida with 1,564.
- Douglas led FSU with 86 yards on four catches against California, including the game-winning 36-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. He also led the Noles in receiving yards at SMU (including a season-long 50-yard catch), Duke and Miami.
- Douglas caught three passes - all on third down - for 70 yards on FSU's game-winning TD drive against the Golden Bears. He converted a 3rd-and-18 with a 27-yard catch, picked up seven yards on a 3rd-and-8 that led to a 4th-down conversion, and his 36-yard touchdown was on 3rd-and-7.
- Douglas added a team-best four catches for 66 yards against Boston College, including a 30-yard catch. Kentron Poitier caught two 29-yard passes and Jaylin Lucas - Douglas' brother - caught a 25-yard pass.

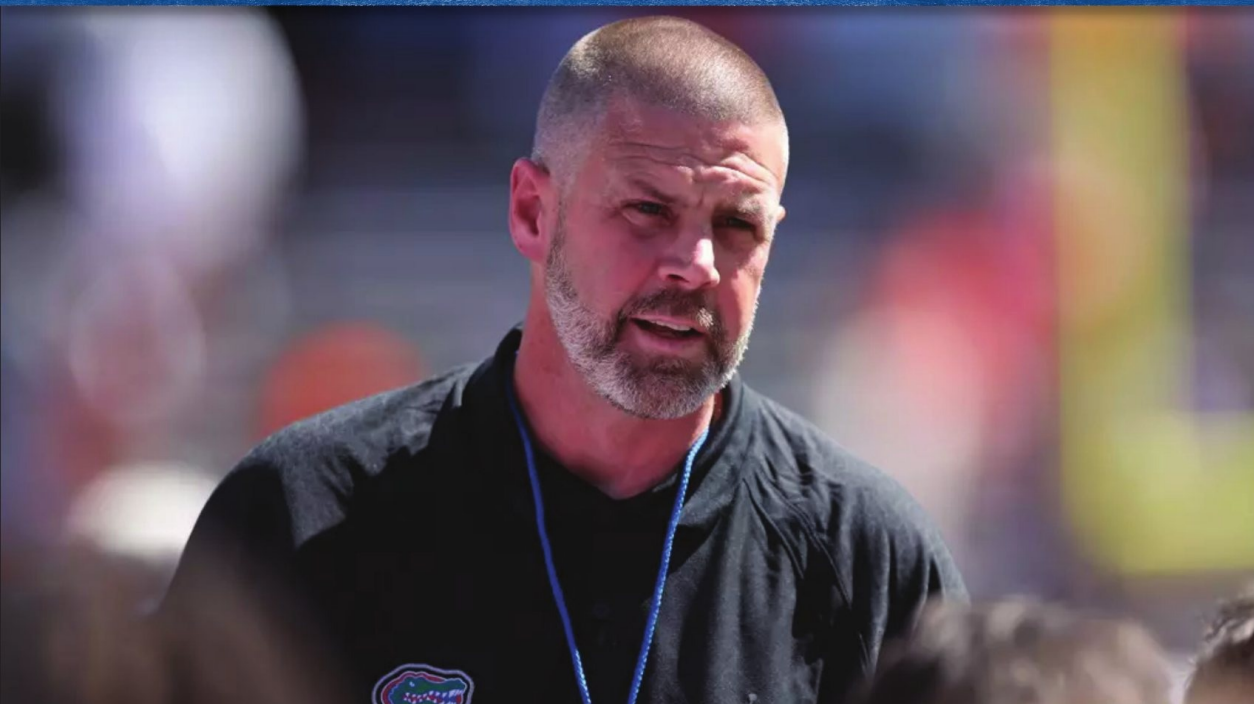
