## FLORIDA STATE vs. PITT

- Florida State hosts Pitt on Saturday for the first time since 2020 and only the second time since the Panthers joined the ACC in 2013. FSU is playing at home for the fifth time in its first six games of 2025.
- The Seminoles have topped 400 yards of total offense in each of their last four games, the program's longest since a five-game stretch in the middle of the 2023 season. Florida State gained 404 yards of offense vs. Miami, the most against the Hurricanes' defense this season.
- FSU boasts one of the nation's most explosive offenses. The Seminoles lead the country in plays of at least 40 yards (13), rank 2nd in 30-plus yard plays (21), 4th in 50-plus yard plays (7) and 7th in 60-plus yard plays (4). The Seminoles are one of 22 teams with an 80-yard play in 2025.
- Florida State leads the country in rushing plays of 10-plus yards (50) and ranks in the top 10 nationally in rushing plays of 20-plus yards (14, 3rd), 40-plus yards (4, 8th) and 50-plus yards (3, 6th). FSU also ranks in the top 10 in passing plays of 30-plus yards (15, 3rd), 40-plus yards (9, 3rd), 50-plus yards (4, 7th), 60-plus yards (3, 4th) and 80-plus yards (1, 1st).
- The Seminoles lead the ACC in rushing touchdowns (20, 2nd nationally), total offense (560.8, 3rd), rushing offense (295.4, 3rd), yards per completion (15.61, 4th), scoring offense (46.8, 5th), 3rd-down percentage (.552, 9th), fewest penalties per game (4.40, 15th) and 4th-down percentage (.733, 21st).



## QUICK HITS

- FSU's 775 yards of total offense in its win vs. Kent State are the most in the nation this season and the most for any team since Dec. 12, 2020, when North Carolina gained 778 yards in a 62-26 win at Miami. The Seminoles, who gained 729 yards of offense vs. East Texas A&M, became the first team with back-to-back 700-yard games since 2015. Florida State boasts two of the four 725-yard games in the nation in 2025 and the only ones from the ACC.
- In records dating back to 1995, FSU is the 18th team nationally and third from the ACC with multiple 725-yard games in the same season. The Seminoles are the first ACC team and one of three nationally with back-to-back games of at least 725 yards of offense, joining Baylor in 2015 and 2013.
- Florida State broke single-game school records with 498 rushing yards, eight rushing touchdowns and 27 rushing first downs in the win vs. Kent State. The rushing yards total was the most in a game against an FBS opponent since Jacksonville State vs. Louisiana Tech in 2023, and the rushing first downs were the most since Air Force vs. Nevada in 2022. The rushing touchdowns were the most by an ACC team since Georgia Tech at Louisville in 2018.
- The Seminoles rolled up 729 yards of total offense vs. East Texas A&M and showcased incredible balance with 361 rushing yards and 368 passing yards. It was only the third time in program history, and first time since 1995, FSU recorded at least 350 rushing yards and at least 350 passing yards in the same game.
- Florida State is the only team in the country that has not allowed a kickoff return in 2025. The Seminoles have produced 36 touchbacks on 36 official kickoffs and also have three onside kick attempts with no returns.

## SETTING THE STANDARD: EARL LITTLE JR. ELEVATES FSU DEFENSE

Defensive back Earl Little Jr. has quickly become a backbone of the Florida State Seminoles' defense. The redshirt junior led the team with seven tackles in last week's game against Miami, showcasing his impact in crucial moments.

A Fort Lauderdale native and the son of former NFL defensive back Earl Little Sr., Little Jr. brings both legacy and high-level experience to the field. He began his college career at Alabama, appearing in 11 games over two seasons, contributing primarily on special teams and in defensive snaps. He made his collegiate debut against Mississippi State and also saw action against Auburn and Austin Peay. Originally recruited as a cornerback out of high school, Little carried his coverage skills, speed, and football knowledge from South Florida to the SEC before transferring to Florida State in 2024.

After transferring to FSU, Little found his stride in the Rover role, allowing him to impact the game in coverage and near the line of scrimmage. "Making that transition to Rover, I feel like that was the right thing to do for me individually and most importantly, for the team, to create that success on the defensive side of the ball," he said. "Being a versatile dude, being able to come down to coverage, play the run, being the right fit, or being in the deep part of the field, it is a vital role. It allows me to play fast"

What sets Little apart is how his playing style elevates those around him. Versatility is at the core of his game, and he hopes his physical approach can inspire his teammates to do the same. "Just me bringing that physicality to the game, I feel like guys around me see that and they're able to stack on that and add that segment to their game. Me bringing that to the table, it sets the standard and it's going to bring our defense up." His energy translates into performance, pushing his teammates to improve while executing a complex and aggressive defense.

He credits FSU's coaching staff, particularly defensive coordinator Tony White, for helping shape that competitive edge. "Everybody loves Coach (Tony) White...he brings that intensity to the defense. We're coming at you from different ways, everybody's just attacking."

Leadership is another defining aspect of Little's game. After this year's first spring practice, he said, "Everybody came out on the right track. Guys are competing, flying around, on both sides of the ball, just out there having fun, getting to know each other better." Even when practices start slow, he steps up to set the tone. Speaking about himself and other team leaders, he explained, "We got together, spoke to all the guys, and told them that it wasn't the standard. Just got everybody going on track."

On the field, Little's leadership translates directly into production. He began 2025 with a nine tackles against his former school as Florida State upset No. 8 Alabama, 31-17. He recorded a career-high 13 tackles against Virginia and led the Seminoles with seven against Miami. From his beginnings at Alabama to becoming a versatile, vocal leader at Florida State, Earl Little has proven that his impact extends beyond just statistics. He brings a standard to practice, leads through physicality, and strives to elevate the play of those around him, all qualities of a teammate you hope to have.

## TOMMY CASTELLANOS

- No. 25 Florida State ranks 3rd nationally with 560.8 yards per game and 5th nationally with 46.8 points per game. FSU surpassed 500 yards in three consecutive games for the first time since 2013 and has over 400 yards of offense in four straight games.
- Against East Texas A&M and Kent State, FSU surpassed 700 total yards in consecutive games for the first time in program history.
- Prior to 2025, the last teams nationally with consecutive 700-yard games were Baylor and TCU in September 2015.
- On top of having a top-5 total and scoring offense, FSU ranks 2nd in rushing offense (295.4 ypg); 4th in passing yards per completion (15.61) and 9th in first downs (139) and 3rd-down conversions (.552).
- FSU had 17 plays of at least 10 yards against No. 3 Miami. The Hurricanes entered the game allowing just 8.25 10-yard plays per game.
- Florida State leads the country with 50 runs of at least 10 yards.



## DUCE ROBINSON

- Duce Robinson leads Florida State with 23 catches, 433 yards and three receiving touchdowns. He is the first Seminole with multiple 140-yard receiving games in a regular season since Craphonso Thorpe in 2003.
- Robinson caught five passes for 173 yards and two touchdowns - from 82 and 42 yards - vs. ETAMU to earn ACC Receiver of the Week. Robinson did not play in the second half.
- Robinson's 160 yards in the first quarter are tied for 2nd in program history in a quarter and the most since 1968. His 173 yards in the first half were the most in a half for a Seminole this century and 4th all-time.
- Robinson's 82-yard touchdown from Tommy Castellanos was the longest catch for a Seminole since the 2019 Sun Bowl. Robinson's yards, receptions, touchdowns and 82-yard catch were all career-highs.

## JA'BRIL RAWLS

- Defensive coordinator Tony White spent the 2023-24 seasons at Nebraska and has held 18 opponents to 20 or fewer points over his last 29 games.
- White's defenses have now gone 11 consecutive home games without allowing a rushing touchdown. Last season at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers became the first team nationally since 2021 to not allow a rushing touchdown at home. It was the first time Nebraska had accomplished the feat since 1939.
- Florida State held No. 8 Alabama to just 87 rushing yards and no rushing touchdowns, Alabama's fewest rushing yards in a season opener since 1975.





- Florida State has made 143 consecutive point-after tries dating back to 2022 after Jake Weinberg made all five at Virginia.
- Florida State tied a school record with 11 made PATs against East Texas A&M. Weinberg is 27-for-27 in 2025 while Bruno Reus is 2-for-2.
- Weinberg is 5-for-6 on field goals, including a career-long 45-yarder vs. No. 8 Alabama. His two field goals vs. No. 3 Miami were a career high.
- All 31 of his career kickoffs have resulted in touchbacks.




