FLORIDA STATE vs. VIRGINIA TECH

- Florida State plays its final home game of the season Saturday night when it hosts Virginia Tech. FSU will recognize its seniors in a pre-game ceremony.
- Mike Norvell is 26-9 (.743) in November as a head coach, including 13-5 (.722) at home, scoring 36.5 points per game and allowing 24.4 points per game.
- The Seminoles have topped 400 yards of total offense in seven games this season. Florida State gained 421 yards vs. Wake Forest, 444 yards at Stanford, 415 yards vs. Pitt, 404 yards vs. Miami, 514 yards at Virginia, 775 yards vs. Kent State and 729 yards vs. East Texas A&M. The Seminoles' total yards are the most allowed this season by Wake Forest, Miami, Virginia, Kent State and East Texas A&M.
- FSU boasts one of the nation's most explosive offenses, leading the ACC and ranking in the top 10 nationally in plays of 30-plus yards (34, 2nd), 40+ yards (18, 3rd), 50+ yards (11, 3rd), 60+ yards (6, 6th) and 20+ yards (57, 7th).
- Florida State ranks 1st in the country in passes of 60-plus yards (5) and is in the top 5 in passing plays of 30-plus yards (27, 3rd), 40-plus yards (14, 3rd), 50-plus yards (8, 3rd) and 80-plus yards (1, 5th). FSU ranks 4th in the country in rushing plays of 10-plus yards (68), 9th in rushes of 20-plus yards (20) and 22nd in 50-plus yard rushes (3).
- Tommy Castellanos ranks 1st in the nation with an average of 15.76 yards per completion and with five 60-yard completions. His 24 passes of at least 30 yards are 1st in the ACC and 2nd in the nation, and his average of 9.46 yards per pass leads the ACC and ranks 5th nationally.

QUICK HITS

- Micahi Danzy leads the country in plays of 50-plus yards (6). He also ranks 1st in the ACC in 40+-yard plays (8, 2nd nationally), 30+-yard plays (11, 3rd) and 50+-yard receptions (4, 3rd).
- The Seminoles lead the ACC in total offense (493.8, 3rd nationally), yards per completion (15.61, 4th), yards per pass (9.46, 6th), rushing offense (226.7, 11th), 3rd-down percentage (.508, 11th) and first downs per game (24.3, 11th)
- Combining 3rd- and 4th-down conversions, FSU's conversion efficiency rate of 61.3 percent (76 total conversions on 124 3rd-downs) is 1st in the ACC and 8th nationally.
- FSU's 775 yards of total offense in its win vs. Kent State are the most in the nation this season and the most for any team since Dec. 12, 2020, when North Carolina gained 778 yards in a 62-26 win at Miami. The Seminoles, who gained 729 yards of offense vs. East Texas A&M, became the first team with back-to-back 700-yard games since 2015. Florida State boasts two of the six 725-yard games in the nation in 2025 and the only ones from the ACC.
- In records dating back to 1995, FSU is the 18th team nationally and third from the ACC with multiple 725-yard games in the same season. The Seminoles are the first ACC team and one of three nationally with back-to-back games of at least 725 yards of offense, joining Baylor in 2015 and 2013.
- Florida State broke single-game school records with 498 rushing yards, eight rushing touchdowns and 27 rushing first downs in the win vs. Kent State. The rushing yards total was the most in a game against an FBS opponent since Jacksonville State vs. Louisiana Tech in 2023, and the rushing first downs were the most since Air Force vs. Nevada in 2022. The rushing touchdowns were the most by an ACC team since Georgia Tech at Louisville in 2018.

RELENTLESS: DARRELL JACKSON JR. LEADS BY EXAMPLE ON SENIOR DAY

As he takes the field for Senior Day, redshirt senior defensive lineman Darrell Jackson Jr. carries with him the lessons of an impressive collegiate career and a legacy built on hard work and leadership.

For Jackson, making the decision to return to Florida State for one final season wasn't about unfinished business, it was about setting the standard.

"The conversation I had with Coach Norvell was basically, 'Be desperate,'" Jackson said. "If I wasn't desperate, don't come back. I just wanted to live up to that expectation I have for myself."

That mentality has fueled Jackson throughout his career. After transferring to Florida State from Miami and sitting out the 2023 regular season due to NCAA transfer rules, Jackson entered 2024 with a renewed mindset and focus.

"I just came in with the mindset that I'm going to work," he said. "Last year was blurry for me, so this year I just said I'm going to get everything I deserve and earn it."

In 2024, Jackson started all 12 games at defensive tackle, recording 32 tackles and earning All-ACC honorable mention recognition.

But for the Havana, Florida, native, success is measured by more than just individual success. It's about leadership and accountability.

On his decision to return to FSU, Jackson said, "I just want to come back and lead this program in the right direction. Becoming a vocal leader and just leading by example."

It's a role he's grown into naturally. "In our D-line room, we've got a standard that we want to play to," Jackson said. "I try to listen to my guys, and they listen to me. I'm the leader of the room, but you know, I can still be corrected. If we see something that can be better, we just hold each other accountable."

That standard carries over to every practice and game.

"The attention in practice has been where we need it," he said. "We just have to continue to do the little things and get off to a faster start."

This season, Jackson has appeared in all nine of Florida State's games, remaining one of the most consistent presence on the defensive line. He's totaled 19 total tackles including 10 solo stops. Jackson recorded one tackle in the win over No. 8 Alabama, added three tackles and a tackle for loss in the victory against East Texas A&M, and posted four tackles versus Kent State. He notched a season-high five tackles against Virginia and followed with four more in the matchup against Miami. He also recorded three tackles in each of the games versus Pitt, Stanford, Wake Forest and Clemson.

Consistency, for Jackson, comes from preparation and embracing the grind.

"Just having the plan, just going man," he said. "You really don't know until you're out there. We're blocking ourselves sometimes, but we'll get there."

In his leadership role, Jackson remains focused on lifting up younger guys in the program.

"I don't want to bring them down. If they fail, I feel like they can always try it again," he said. "If they fail, just say 'Hey man, go take breather and try again, you're going to get it.'"

As Jackson prepares for his final game at Doak Campbell Stadium, he does so with pride in what he has accomplished and in the person he has become both on and off the field.

When asked to define the Seminoles' defensive identity, Jackson didn't hesitate.

"Relentless," he said.

And that word might just define him too.

- Florida State's offense is led by dynamic quarterback Tommy Castellanos. Castellanos is one of 10 active players nationally with 5,000 passing yards and 1,700 rushing yards in his career.
- He enters the Virginia Tech game with 5,817 pass yards, 1,786 rush yards and 65 total touchdowns.
- Castellanos leads the country with 15.76 yards per completion and is 5th with 9.46 yards per pass attempt.
- Castellanos completed 12 of 16 passes for 271 yards, one touchdown and one rushing touchdown vs. Wake Forest.



DUCE ROBINSON

- Duce Robinson leads Florida State with 43 catches, 813 yards and four receiving touchdowns. He is the first Seminole with three 140-yard receiving games in a regular season since Snoop Minnis in 2000.
- Robinson and Keon Coleman in 2023 are the only Seminoles in the past decade with multiple games with 9+ catches in a season. Robinson tied a career high with nine catches for 124 yards at Clemson.
- Robinson leads the ACC and ranks 2nd nationally with four games of 120+ receiving yards. Only Rashad Greene - with five in 2014 - has more 120-yard receiving games for a Nole over the past 20 years.

EARL LITTLE JR.

- Earl Little Jr. earned his first career start against No. 8 Alabama and led the game with a then-career-high nine tackles, including a two-yard tackle for loss.
- Entering the contest against his former team, Little had tallied 17 tackles in 23 career games.
- Little led FSU with a career-high 13 tackles at Virginia, the most for a Seminole this season. Little and Ja'Bril Rawls (11) were the first Seminole teammates with 10+ tackles in a game since 2022.
- Little is 3rd in the ACC and leads FSU with four interceptions, the most for a Seminole since 2021. He had an interception in three consecutive games, the first Seminole to do that since Tarvarus McFadden had a four-game stretch in 2016.



JA'BRIL RAWLS

- Redshirt sophomore Ja'Bril Rawls made his first career start against No. 8 Alabama, finishing with six tackles and one pass breakup.
- At Virginia, Rawls had a career-high 11 tackles, his first career interception and his first career tackle for loss in the contest.
- Rawls was the first Seminole with at least 11 tackles, 1.0 TFL and one interception in an ACC game since current assistant linebackers coach Ernie Sims posted the same stat line vs. Maryland in 2005.
- Against Pitt, Rawls led FSU with 10 tackles - all solo - with a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss. He was the first Seminole since Jammie Robinson vs. Oklahoma in the 2022 Cheez-It Bowl with at least 10 solo tackles.




