

# Cross Country Team Wins

Florida State University's cross country team rolled to another win this weekend, beating the University of South Florida in Tampa, Saturday by a score of 24-31.

who finished seventh and Jack Wise who was good enough for a ninth place finish.

One runner for South Florida, Coswell Depeiza, a man from Trinidad, finished second in a much improved performance over his first outing against the Seminoles. The first time the two teams met four weeks ago, Depeiza could only manage a fifth place finish as South Florida fell 23-32.

The coach of the team, Dick Roberts, said the squad was much more competitive than in any previous meet, though he does feel that they do need some work on their pacing which will help bring down their times.

This coming weekend the Seminole iron men face their toughest assignment of the season when they go to Pine Mt., Georgia, to compete in the Calloway Gardens Invitational

which will feature most of the top teams from around the Southeast.

The Calloway course is a 6-mile layout featuring some of the toughest terrain on any course the team will be on this season.

Commenting on the young Seminoles' chances of winning the meet coach Roberts said that if he is able to get in the needed pace works this week and if the team shows the same "competitive spirit and confidence" that they did against South Florida, they could remain undefeated in the collegiate ranks this weekend.

"If we are to be anything this year, we'll have to show it this weekend," concluded Roberts.

The meet is scheduled for this Saturday at 11 a.m. and will feature such Southeastern powerhouses as Tennessee and the University of Florida.
