

Ramers, Misner represent FSU well in Callaway meet

Florida State continued to make its presence felt in cross country races around the South this past weekend as both Ken Misner and Del Ramers ran well at the Callaway Gardens Invitational held in Pine Mountain, Ga.

Ramers, an FSU varsity runner this year, was the seventh collegian to finish in the huge field and crossed the line 15th overall. The junior was the only FSU racer to place high, since Bobby Brooks was not allowed to run due to an illness.

Misner, on the other hand, is a former FSU star who is now running for the Florida Track

Club while training in Tallahassee. He was third overall in the final standings and second in his non-collegiate division.

What was most surprising about the meet, however, were the times recorded. According to Coach Dick Roberts, the Callaway Gardens course had been extended a little to almost six miles. The times, however, were much better than the previous year.

"I think I could say that the reason for this is training," said Roberts in reference to the great times. "Every year we wonder where the improvement will end and every season we become

even more amazed at the outcome."

An example of the improvement in times comes from Misner himself. Even though the track was longer, he ran a time which was 25 seconds under the existing track record when the course was shorter. Ramers ran a time that was better than Misner's last year.

Winner of the individual title in the meet was Neil Cuzak, who hails from East Tennessee State. A sophomore in college, Cuzak led his team to the top honors in the collegiate class.

Huff now is leader in passing

Florida State's junior football quarterback Gary Huff has moved into the number one position this week in passing statistics released yesterday.

Huff moved past Virginia Tech quarterback Don Strock in passing offense as he has completed 18.0 tosses a game while Strock is only making 17.8 good a game. Auburn's Pat Sullivan is third with 17.7 per game.

Besides individual passing, Huff is second in total offense with a 240.3 yard per game average. Strock is leading this category and Sullivan is third.

In team passing statistics, FSU is ranked third behind Virginia Tech and the University of Washington. The Seminoles have passed for 249.9 yards a game while Washington is going for 253.1 a contest and Tech
