

Golfers Capture Second At CCIT

FSU's Carl DiCesare fired a four-round total of 300 to lead the Seminole golfers to a second place finish in the Cape Coral Intercollegiate Invitational Golf Tournament this weekend.

DiCesare's total earned him a second place tie for individual honors with Wally Armstrong from the U of F. The Gators' Bob Murphy who is the current National Amateur Champion, led all scorers with a four-round total of 294.

The U of F captured team honors in the 10-school event with a 1,214 score to the Seminoles 1,228. Purdue was third with 1,243.

The University of Florida senior's final round two-over-par 74 gave him a 294 total.

TEAMMATE Mike Toale's 70 enabled Florida to win the team championship for the second consecutive year. Louisiana State was 11 strokes back for second. Florida State was third, followed by Purdue and Duke.

Tied for individual second place were Wally Armstrong, Florida; Carl Di Cesare, Florida State, and Larry Hinson, East Tennessee State, with 300s.

Mike Keck of Louisiana State and Denny Lyons, Florida State followed with 303s. Both shot 77 in the final round.

Toale's sub-par performance gave him a 304 total. Next were Tom Hackett of Duke and D. Schumaker of Purdue, 306.
