

## Tennis Team Tops Emory, 9-0; Play Four Games On Road

After evening up their season mark at 4-4, Florida State's tennis team plays four straight matches beginning today, every one on the road.

The netmen face Mercer, the Georgia Bulldogs, Georgia Tech and Emory.

FSU holds decisions over Georgia Tech by a 6-3 count and over Emory 9-0. Georgia handed the Seminoles their opening loss of the season, 6-3.

In Saturday's match FSU blanked Emory, 9-0. Winners for the Tribe in singles were Hal Schaus, Shelby Creagh, Lex Hester, Fred Serrett, Charles Nordlinger and Sonny Sellers.

Serrett had the toughest match going three sets to defeat Steve Schulman, 6-4, 10-12, 6-3.

In the doubles, Jim Maddock and Nordlinger defeated John Loudermilk and Jim Griffin, 7-5,

6-2. Serrett and Sellers came from behind to down John Fraser and Schulman 2-6, 7-5, 6-3, while Hester and Dick Sweetman also took three sets to defeat Rick Perry and John Jenkins 7-5, 4-6, 9-7.

Scores of the singles matches were 6-1, 6-3, Schaus downing Loudermilk, Creagh over Griffin 6-1, 6-2, Hester topping Fraser 6-3, 6-1, Nordlinger beating Perry 6-2, 6-2, and Sellers losing just one game to Jenkins to cop an easy set 6-1, 6-0.

Besides victories over Emory and Georgia Tech, the Tribe blanked both Ohio State and Southern Illinois 9-0. Losses came at the hands of Miami, Florida, Indiana and Georgia.

Coach Pitchford's netters are now at the halfway point for the season. The remaining teams they face after this road trip are Florida Southern, Mercer, the University of Florida and Rollins.
