Florida's first woman's swim team, with a victory in the last event of the day Saturday, captured its first meet 60½-52½ over Florida State's woman's team.

Lynn Worley and Diane Schober led the Gators to victory, winning five individual races in the meet.

schober won the first individual race held in the meet, that being the 200 freestyle, winning it with a time of 2:11.5. The Pennsylvania gal also captured the 500 back and 100 back races.

But it was Worley that changed the match to Florida's side.

In the 400 free relay, the Gators were leading by less than a half length over the Florida State team when Worley, swimming in the third spot on the relay entered the pool. By the end of her two lap sprint, the Gators were far enough in the lead to insure victory.

And without the last relay victory, where

seven points were awarded the winner and none to the second place team, the Gators would be 0-1 in their short season (this was the only meet of the quarter, although a return match with FSU is scheduled for next quarter in Tallahassee).
