

## Women's team to host UF girls Saturday

Swimming will be on the schedule this weekend for the FSU women's team as it hosts rival Florida at the Union pool this Saturday beginning at 10 a.m.

It will be the first home meet and the second of the season. Back in November the FSU girls lost to this same Gator team 60% to 52%.

Three of the girls qualified for the nationals last November. Barbara Stainsby made the time for the 400 and 200-yard freestyles, Kathy Fitzpatrick qualified in the 200-yard individual medley and the 100-yard freestyle while Lena Oding was quick enough in the 50 and 100-yard breaststrokes.

No admission will be charged to the event. The Seminole girls will have several other meets this quarter, including one against Mississippi State College for Women and Miami.

## try to revenge early loss to Gators **Women swimmers host UF**

FSU will be meeting the University of Florida from both angles this Saturday as the women also take on the Gators in a match at Union Pool beginning at 10 a.m.

The meet will be in many ways a grudge rematch of the two schools who met earlier in the season with Florida emerging the victor, 60%-52%.

FSU has had no matches since that first Florida encounter and this will also be the team's first home meet of the campaign.

Starring for the Seminole girls will probably be Kathy Fitzpatrick, a freshman from Jacksonville with an extensive swimming background in both form and speed swimming. Fitzpatrick qualified for national competition in the first Florida meet for both the 100 and 200 yard freestyles.

This time around Fitzpatrick will be trying the Gators in the 50 and 100 yard freestyle events.

Lena Oding will be entered in both of the breaststroke events. She also qualified for both of these events in the UF meet.

In the other two specialty

events will be Alice Dorn and Ellen Smalling. Dorn is FSU's top backstroker and Smalling finds her specialty is the butterfly.

## All pool marks fall as girls drop UF meet

Christi Agnew, FSU women's swim team member, and the Florida Gators women's swim team broke all Union pool records in a Saturday meet.

In their second meet of the year, the Seminole women lost to Florida 78-35, winning only two events. Agnew won the 400-yard freestyle with a new record of 4:46.2, and the 200-yard freestyle with a time of 2:15.5. Previous record time for the 200 freestyle was 2:18.8.

Florida broke nine pool records, in the 200 individual medley, 50 backstroke, 50 breaststroke, 50 butterfly, 50 freestyle, 100 freestyle, 100 breaststroke, and 100 backstroke events.

FSU placed second in seven events. In the 200-yard individual medley the team broke the pool record with a time of 2:08.1 compared to the record 2:08.9. But Florida still outdid the Seminoles, with a time of 2:04.5.

Kathy Fitzpatrick, second in the 50-yard freestyle, also broke the record with a 27.2 time, but the Gators again had the lower time. Fitzpatrick had a time of 59.5 in the 100-yard freestyle compared to a record 1:01.2. The Gator swimmer topped her with a phenomenal 58.8.

In the 100-yard breaststroke with yet another record-breaking time was Lena Oding in 1:19.5. Missy Willoughby of UF surpassed Oding and the previous record of 1:20.6 in 1:14.0 time.

Florida State qualified for the nationals in the medley and freestyle. Nationals are March 16-18 in Cincinnati, Ohio. The women tankers' next meet is at home, March 4, against Mississippi State College for Women.
