

FSU hosts womens volleyball

Florida State will host its second Women's Intercollegiate Volleyball Tournament this weekend with nine teams representing Florida, Mississippi and Georgia in competition.

The tournament will run Friday and Saturday with all matches being scheduled for Tully Gym. First games will begin at 8 p.m. Friday night and play will resume Saturday beginning at 8:30 a.m.

Besides FSU, the nine other teams that will be competing are Miami Dade South JC, the team that placed fifth nationally last year, Broward JC, Flagler, Georgia Southern, Jacksonville University, Miami Dade North JC, Mississippi State College for Women, Rollins, University of South Florida and West Georgia.

The play will be in the form of a round robin tournament

with two divisions of five teams.

FSU's first game is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. Saturday morning.

Florida State has another strong team this year with several returning members of the varsity team last year on the

squad.

The championship game is scheduled to begin at around 1:30 p.m. Saturday. There is no admission charge to any of the matches.

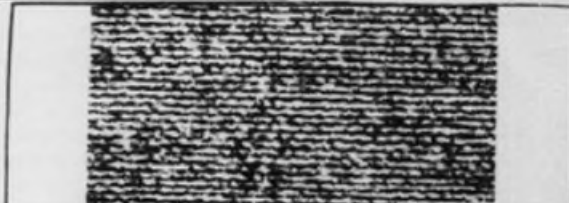
