Coach Billie Joe Jones' FSU entry would up the Columbus tourney with a 6-1 record, well ahead of West Georgia College's 2-2 mark, The West

Georgia girls had captured the Columbus meet the four preceeding years.

Entries for this weekend's tournament are expected from South Florida, Miami-Dade South JC, Miami-Dade North JC, Florida Tech, Florida A&M, Rollins, Jacksonville, Flaglar College, Troy State, Georgia College, Auburn, Mississippi State College for Women and Tuskegee.
